UK to NZ Pension Transfer Update – Counting Down to 1st December!

When you bring your UK pension to NZ, the current UK rules allow a New Zealand QROPS (Qualifying Recognised Overseas Pension Scheme) to pay members a lump sum amount of approx. 30% of their transferred UK fund at age 55, plus



provide an income for life. However, New Zealand legislation coming into force on 1st December 2016 will restrict withdrawals significantly, only allowing less than 10% in total to be paid at this age.

Therefore, if you wish to take advantage of the current legislation, it is imperative that your pension transfer is well underway before 30th November. It typically takes six months to complete the transfer process, so phone Tony Chamberlain and the GBPensions team on 0800 427 693 as soon as possible or visit www.GBPensions.co.nz to learn more. 


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Fleeing driver incidents must end

A stolen Mazda was seen by police on Waimumu Road, Massey. Police followed the vehicle for a short time then stopped alongside it at an intersection where they signalling the driver to pull over. The driver initially indicted that they would comply, but then drove off at speed along Central Park Drive.

Police activated lights and sirens and a pursuit was initiated. The vehicle passed Te Pai Place, travelled over the bridge spanning Henderson Creek along Central Park Drive. After the bridge the driver lost control of the vehicle, veering over the footpath on the left side of the road. The vehicle proceeded up the bank and skidded along the grass coming to rest against a nearby tree. The driver's side took the full impact.

The driver was initially trapped in the vehicle which caught fire. Officers used fire extinguishers to stop the fire whilst other officers extracted the driver from the car. The driver was taken to hospital with serious injuries, while three police officers were assessed by ambulance staff at the scene for the effects of smoke inhalation.

The driver, a 15-year-old male spent significant time in Auckland Hospital.

Acting Area Commander Inspector Claire Humble says this is another example of the tragic consequences which can occur if a driver fails to comply with a simple instruction by police to stop.

"This is a devastating event for both the victim and his family, as well as my staff. This situation could have easily been avoided had the driver pulled over.

"I also note that my staff put themselves at considerable risk to get the driver out of the car while it was on fire.

"Once again we must give the message that if you are told to stop by police, then just pull over and get the matter sorted out. The consequences of not doing so can lead to a devastating outcome, as we saw" said Inspector Humble.

New Dawn for Grand Old Home

Insomniacs and early risers would have been in for a strange sight recently at Hobsonville Point – the rather imposing Base Commander's house rumbling down Sunderland Ave in the dark, small hours of the morn-



ing, on the back of a truck. At 260m2, it's a large house to be moved in a single piece. Building removal specialist, Craig Walker says it tested the limits of their equipment and provided the kind of challenge he and his team relish. The house was moved to a new site on the corner of Sunderland Avenue, where ten other heritage homes have been expertly refurbished by developer Willis Bond & Co. In one of life's happy coincidences, Craig lived in the house as a small boy, so he was delighted when his firm won the contract to move the house. Craig's father was the Base Commander at Hobsonville Air Base when the family lived in the house between 1961 and 1964. In those days the Second World War was still fresh in people's minds and the Base Commander had a position of status. "Dad even had his own batman [the military version of a valet] to help with domestic duties." The house was far larger than any of the other homes on the base. Through the eyes of a six year old boy it was "absolutely massive". Craig recalls grand Christmas parties for Auckland's leading militaryandpublicfiguresinabigtop-sizedmargueeonthefrontlawn. Military training was compulsory in New Zealand until 1972 and Craig says the base was busy with soldiers marching and performing drills. "They overflowed the barracks so they were housed in long rows of tents." For the children of the officers that lived on the base there were some perks. "We were allowed to use the swimming pool. We had a swimming vest and once you'd passed your swimming test your badge was sewn onto your vest and you could swim." They could also use the tennis courts and gymnasium. On the other hand, there were also some 'nogo' zones and if they strayed into forbidden areas the marshal charged with maintaining law and order on the base would be after them. "If you got caught by the marshal you were in heaps of trouble. We were pretty scared of him". The Base Commander's house was moved in one piece to preserve as much of the original timber as possible. Cutting the house would have required it to be respliced with modern



materials. Once renovated it will complete Sunderland Avenue, a street of 1930s officers' houses which have been painstakingly restored by Willis Bond. The Base Commander's House will be brought to market when its restoration is complete. Craig says he feels "honoured" to be part of shifting his onetime family home. "Auckland is a wooden town - or at least it was until the seventies. We're lucky that we can move these buildings to preserve them. I think Hobsonville Point is an amazing template for residential development in New Zealand. Keeping the old houses and buildings adds dignity to the whole development. When you drive around the corner and see all of the Sunderland houses lined up and given a new lease on life, it's brilliant. I have nothing but praise for their [Hobsonville Land Company's] approach." You can also view the recently relocated Base Commander's House on its new site. Isthmus installed them for HLC. Wind continues to blow across Hobsonville Point as it has for millennia. Birds take wing from the mudflats where planes once flew from the grass. The wind-



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socks provide a playful touch to this airborne heritage.

Why 10? We would have covered the place if we could! The original concept was to use windsocks to mark the old runway alignment. The windsocks would be built around and then slowly repositioned as the development grew. Then over time slowly removed as the development continued to be built out. This concept got simplified to a collec-



tion of windsocks near the entrance to Hobsonville. Here they can have impact and be allowed to fly for some time to come. The windsocks are designed to be temporary so they can be repositioned or removed easily.

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



- 1/2 teaspoon ginger

- 1/4 teaspoon Chinese five-spice
- 1/4 teaspoon cloves
- 1/4 teaspoon allspice
- 1/2 teaspoon concentrated natural vanilla extract
 pinch of salt

Place the ingredients into your processor and blend at high speed until the mixture resembles a fine, sticky crumb. Use your hands to press and shape the mixture into balls. Place in the fridge to set. Eat and enjoy!

15 min Chocolate squares

Base:

1 ¾ Tbsp Cocoa
 ½ tsp Baking Powder
 1 cup Flour
 Pinch salt
 1 cup cornflakes
 1 cup coconut
 ¾ cup sugar
 150 g butter

Remove from oven and while it is still hot cut into squares and spread chocolate icing over the entire top. The icing will soak in and make the slice more 'fudgy'.

- 1. Cut the tuna into a few long rectangular pieces, approximate-
- ly 3 x 6 x 15cm, depending on the size of your fish
- 2. Put the fish into a deep bowl or saucepan, pour in hot boiled



water. Use chopsticks to quickly turn the fish over to ensure all sides are well covered and turn "white"

3. Immediately soak the fish into cold water to avoid "over-cook-ing"



Hydrotherapy is best carried out in warm water (26-30 degrees C), which contributes to improvement in function and a more effective and comfortable form of exercise.

Hydrotherapy exercise is demanding on the dog's cardiovascular system and is therefore not suitable for dogs with heart conditions. Swimming requires four times as much effort as land-based exercise, so a five minute swim is equivalent to a 20 minute brisk walk. Thus, it provides rapid improvement in cardiovascular fitness, boosts healing, burns energy and builds strength.

Reactivity, what is it? While it comes in many different forms, reactivity is a common behaviour problem that many people en-



counter at some point in their dogs' lives. Simply put, reactivity can be defined as an overreaction to external stimuli. Dogs may be reactive to people, dogs, other animals, noises, motion, or any combination of the above. Some dogs are very specifically reactive, only responding to certain things (men with baseball caps; large, black dogs; skateboards) while some seem to react to anything. This overreaction can manifest as hyperexcitability, barking, whining, lunging, mouthing, pacing, panting, difficulty responding to well-known cues, difficulty calming down, hypervigilance, or any combination of the above.

Building and Housing Minister

Building and Housing Minister Dr Nick Smith has welcomed the decision by the Hobsonville Land Company (HLC) to bring forward the development of 1000 new homes at Hobsonville Point in Auckland. "The decision by Hobsonville Land Company to speed up the release of precincts at Buckley B, the Village and the apartment site near the Hobsonville Point Primary School means that more homes will be delivered faster. These homes would not have been available until 2019 on the previous schedule, but they will now come on-stream from 2017 – providing an additional 1000 new homes more quickly to help address Auckland's urgent housing need," Dr Smith says. "I further

welcome the Company's target to deliver a higher proportion of affordably priced homes at the Buckley B and Village precincts. At least twenty per cent of all the homes built at Hobsonville Point are already sold at under \$550,000 - at these two sites, the proportion will be 30 per cent." Hobsonville is former Defence Force land that is being developed by Housing New Zealand subsidiary Hobsonville Land Company. The first sod for housing was turned in 2002 by the then-Labour Prime Minister but no further work was carried out as the project became mired in planning disputes. The National-led Government revived a housing plan for the land in 2010, and the land was given Special Housing Area status under the new Housing Accords and Special Housing Areas Act in 2013. Earthworks were consented a week later and now 716 homes and sections have been sold. The development also includes parks, playgrounds, cycleways, walking tracks, a farmers market and new schools. Last year the Mayor of Auckland and the Prime Minister opened the new ferry terminal and service to downtown Auckland. HLC chief executive Chris Aiken said that the last twelve months had seen record house sales at Hobsonville Point, with 337 homes sold in the twelve months to the end of May 2015. "We see strong demand continuing, especially driven by the more affordable end of the market. We are bringing forward the development of Buckley B by around two years and the Village development by one year, while construction of the apartments near the primary school has been accelerated by revising super lot plans and the approach to land release in that block – all of which makes good sense in light of current market conditions," Mr Aiken says. "Earthworks on the Buckley B precinct are planned for this coming summer and master planning for the Village precinct will commence immediately. This accelerated development timetable ensures that builders have sufficient land in two to three years' time to continue momentum. It reflects both the very strong demand and the planning lead time of up to two years between starting a precinct and the first homes being complet-

ed," Mr Aiken says. So far at Hobsonville Point, around 550 new homes are either under construction or have been completed. HLC and its development partners have allocated builder-ready land to builders for a further 500 homes in the last stages of the Buckley A precinct, the first stage of the Catalina Precinct and in the Sunderland A precinct; building homes on this land is starting now. HLC also has development partners in place for around another 500 homes in the Sunderland precinct and the second stage of the Catalina Precinct, ready for construction to begin at these sites in mid-2016. This means that – in addition to the homes already completed or under construction – there are 1000 additional homes in the pipeline in precincts where development is already underway. The initiative announced today is additional to this, and brings the total of homes that are either complete, under construction or in the development pipeline to 2550. "The Government is focused on increasing the supply of housing in Auckland, and Hobsonville Land Company is at the forefront of this. I commend Mr Aiken and the team at HLC on the successes achieved to date, and look forward to more in the future," Dr Smith says. "Hobsonville Point illustrates the type of scale and momentum the Government wants to support, and the type of development that Auckland needs to address its housing supply and affordability challenge. "We have a wide programme of complementary initiatives in place, including constraining new section development contributions, removing tariffs on building materials, and making record investments in building apprenticeships. Our KiwiSaver HomeStart scheme, which came into effect on 1 April 2015, provides financial assistance to 90,000 first-home buyers. The next key measure is our planned second phase of the Resource Management Act reforms to tackle the long-term issues affecting housing affordability and supply."

For now, here are a few tricks to getting the most out of your paint scheme. Test your colour before painting the whole room. Trust me! Grab a test pot and on a large A2 sheet of card, paint two coats, leaving a 2cm border around the edge. Place this card in different areas of the house (north and south facing) and examine it during the day and night.

Paint the ceiling a colour. Yes, that's right, out with the old boring white ceiling and in with the bold and beautiful! Add a feature pendant light and watch the mood of your room completely change.



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Use some of this season's elegant but bold colours; burnt orange, grape purple, deep green, teal and mustard yellow. Experiment, it's fun and easy! If you need more persuasion, peruse through Pinterest and score some yummy ideas.

Natural and artificial lighting have an enormous effect on the paint colour. The same colour will look different depending on the orientation of the space; north facing rooms tend to make colours look warmer while south facing rooms make colours look cooler.

Likewise with artificial lighting; a cool LED will keep your bright whites fresh (great for a white bathroom) while a warm LED will make your paint colour look warmer and whites creamier. There's a whole raft of tricks when it comes to paint and lighting! If you're going dark, consider using a multi-pigmented paint in a flat or low sheen. This will give you a great perception of depth; walls that will draw you in and hug you rather than slap you in the face. Using a flat finish will help disguise surface imperfections.

However, I still recommend a level 5 plasterboard finish. Finally, make sure you nail your lighting. Have plenty and dimmable so you can control the mood.

Get your colour strength right. If you'd like your ceiling to be the same colour as your skirting and/or walls, then make your ceiling 1-2 shades lighter. Ceilings receive less light so will always appear darker.

Decorating is all about taking risks. Even the pros get it wrong from time to time. If you make a mistake, just take a step back, put your detective hat on and ask yourself what the missing link is, what's not quite working? Then tweak until voila! Magic happens!

Dogs on leads

There has been some discussion of late regarding the dogs on leads policy, so hopefully I can clear some of this up. I was involved heavily with the Hobsonville Land Company when the signs first went up, and discussed with them at length at the time. The Hobsonville Point Residents Society were pleased when as an offer the land company built a dog park. Not something they had to do, but an offer of goodwill while they managed their health and safety policy for the development of the area. Since then in addition the council went through a proposal and feedback process. It is now in the council policy applying to all of Hobsonville Point "Apply an under control on-leash rule on Hobsonville Point Walkway and associated reserves." This came into effect October 2015, so is in-force now.

Clearly the fenced dedicated dog park at Bomb Point is off leash, and the only area within Hobsonville point where dogs can be off leash.

There will be different views on what people see as annoying or threatening when a dog is found to be off the leash. My view is that the communication needs to be.

If dogs are seen of the leash, the first thing to do if you feel safe in doing so is to point out to the owner that HP is an on leash only area, and there is a dedicated dog park at Bomb Point. There is no shortage of signs around parks that people could refer to. Whether this is a HLC sign or council is now irrelevant as the law is in place. At this stage as many may not even be aware of the law, it is an education thing.

If the dogs are being a nuisance, then they should call the coun-



cil who will send out dog control. If the dogs are in anyway aggressive, then the first call should be to the police. The police have the ability to prosecute, and you yourself have the right to take up a civil case if there is damage to person, pets or property. I myself was a dog owner up until earlier this year, and I understand there are different points of view. However the council rules are now very clear and there is an education phase that people need to consider. We can all be friendly when we approach the situation while keeping ourselves and kids safe.

Gardening Tips

With the cooler days settling in it's now time to get your winter vegetable garden ready, plant trees, pop in some spring flowering bulbs and either establish or repair lawns.

Summer crops are coming to an end in the cooler areas of the country and the early frosts may start to appear. Pick the last of the tomatoes and let them ripen in a sunny spot indoors. Replenish compost and start sowing your winter harvest. Carrots, chinese broccoli, cabbages, coriander and parsley do well at this time of year. This time of year is one of the best times to plant your flowering garden. The soil is still relatively warm and moist, and they can establish over winter before the spring blooms. Deadhead, prune back plants that have finished flowering. Fertilise new and established bulbs well.

Aphids, slugs, snails and white butterflies can still be out especially if the weather is still warm. Their numbers would have increased over the summer. Squash small infestations with your finger or blast off with a hose. Lay slug or snail bait down every few weeks to keep slugs and snails at bay.



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
