Please do what you can to assist them by shopping locally. Even the Toy Library has click & collect. Read about how volunteers at Massey Vinnies are providing support with their foodbank. 

Message from Massey Police

We all love our mobile phones. They are a life-line these days containing business contacts, important reminders, precious and treasured photos, many of which are totally irreplaceable. Imagine the panic of losing it.

Some tips for keeping your phone safe and getting it back should you unfortunately lose it.

If handed into a Police station and not locked, it's easy.

However if your phone is locked, we don't have any magic formulas for unlocking it or

locating you. Keep phoning it, we will keep it charged for a period, in the hope you are looking for it. It's amazing how many phones are destroyed because we can't find the owners.

The biggest tip for getting back a locked phone is prevention. Take a photo of your business card and set it as your wallpaper. While it's cute to have your kids or your puppy as your screensaver, your business card details could be the difference between being reunited with your phone or not. If you don't have a business card,



get creative. Make up a note, "if this phone is found - please call (Put your nearest and dearest's contact phone number).

And finally, check if your phone has 'Medical Emergency Information'. This is different from Emergency which will allow you to call Emergency services on a locked phone bypassing the password. MEI does the same. You can fill this with info including your name, alternative contact number as well as vital medical info and it can be accessed over a lock down.



The Scott Point Sustainable Sports Park

The Scott Point Sustainable Sports Park is an Auckland Council initiative on a 16.4 hectare (40 acre) site bounded by Clark Road and Squadron Drive at the hub of the Hobsonville, Hobsonville Point and Scott Point communities.



Work is now under way and the park will be developed in stages over the coming years. The first stage includes developing two sports fields, a baseball diamond, carpark, shared paths, temporary toilets and changing facilities. The roads at Joshua Carder Drive extension and Craigs Way will also be constructed. First up is clearing the site and ecological activities involving lizard capture and relocation, transplanting native Epilobium plants (the critically endangered



native species found locally), tree felling and demolition of most of the old buildings onsite. The site will be blessed as soon as Covid-19 lockdown restrictions allow and then earthworks will start.

The significance of Scott Point is deeply held in the historic, traditional, cultural and spiritual relationships of mana whenua (Māori values) to the area. The land was previously used for horticultural and grazing activities. Many of the landscape features relating to this use are still present but will be removed to make way for the park. The ecology will be enhanced by re-vegetating the existing contaminated and hard infrastructure nursery area, replacing exotic plants with native vegetation and reducing the area covered by grassland. The sports field will be irrigated by rainwater collected in recycled plastic units placed under the field. Sustainability has been at the forefront of the design. Keep an eye on the Upper Harbour Local Board Facebook page for updates.

over 100%, with the need to open support direct to the community.

Last month saw food provided to hundreds of adults and children, with another jump expected this month. Operating solely on donations we're always aware of the need to be resourceful, so, one of our most exciting connections has been with the NZ Food network and Fair Food, who specialise in rescuing food that can't be sold but is good to eat, to help 'feed the need'.



What is fake news?

Fake news is information that is either totally or in part inaccurate. It can appear anywhere and be created by anyone. Netsafe has more information available to help adults spot and identify fake news on

Why does it matter?

1. Kids may be confused or misled about what they see which could impact on their learning and wellbeing if they start to feel anxious about something.

2. Some fake news is either deliberately hateful or aimed at people in minority groups which can have offline consequences.

Netsafe's top tips for tamariki

1. Explain to your child what fake news is, how it's created and why they need the skills to determine what's fact and what's fake.

2. Teach your child to fact check - explain what sites are trustworthy, where you get information from and how you check the reliability of what you see.

3. Hone their critical thinking skills. Encourage them to ask themselves does this sound right? Is there another explanation for this information? Could this be a joke?

4. Encourage your child to read beyond a headline before they take something at face value or share it with other people.

5. Build digital literacy. Critical thinking skills are more relevant now. Teach children to be cautious, vigilant, and creative digital citizens.

Newest (and cutest) residents in Hobsonville

If you've been to the beach lately and found it a bit crowded, you're not the only one. Some of New Zealand's native coastal birds find beaches crowded too and have moved to make their homes in the next best habitat they can find - empty building sites. This may seem risky for small birds like the tūturiwhatu



(New Zealand dotterel), but the sites tick many of their boxes for a home. They like flat surfaces with good lines of sight to watch for predators, lack of people, and sandy surfaces suitable for a 'scrape' in which to lay eggs. There are only about 2500 NZ dotterels left.

Residents in Hobsonville Point have been keeping an eye out for dotterels and working with developers to make sure they are safe and secure while nesting. Two eggs have recently hatched, and the little balls of fluff that are baby dotterels are running around

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looking for insects and worms to eat. They will take up to six weeks to fledge (grow flight feathers and leave the nest), and until that time are very vulnerable, even with their parents bravely chasing threats away. Domestic cats are one of their most dangerous predators, and everyone can help these little chicks survive by keeping pet cats in at night, and keeping dogs leashed while walking.

The Story of Scouting

Today there are more than 50 million Scouts, young people and adults, male and female, in over 200 countries and territories.



Scouts was first formed in 1907

By Robert Baden-Powell, it began as an experimental camp with just 20 boys.

The camp was a great success and proved to its organiser, Robert Baden-Powell that his training and methods appealed to young people and really worked. In January 1908, Baden-Powell published the first edition of "Scouting for Boys", and has since sold over 100 million copies, making it one of the bestselling books of all time.

Since then, over 500 million people have been Scouts, including prominent people in every field.

The first World Scout Jamboree took place in 1920 with 8,000 participants, and proved that young people from different nations could come together to share common interests and ideals. Since that first World Jamboree at Olympia in London, there have been 21



others at different locations. The last World Jamboree held in North America in 2019 was attended by 45,000 Scouts, that's more than the population of Te Atatū Peninsula, Te Atatu South and Henderson combined.

The Early Scout Programme

Scouting began as a programme for boys 11 to 18 years of age. Yet almost immediately others also wanted to participate. The Girl Guides programme was started in 1910 by Baden-Powell who designated his sister Agnes to manage it. In 1915 Robert Baden-Powell became Chairman of the Girl Guides Association, and his wife Olave, whom he married in 1912, became the new Chief Guide in 1918.

Today in New Zealand, Guides and Scouts have a combined membership of approx. 25,000.

Our lives are made up from thousands of micro-moments or stories. Some stories we want to hold onto, to relive the feeling of and cherish forever.

It may be the story of marrying your soulmate, bringing your babies home, their first day of school, your first school ball or snuggling into daddy's shirt.



Sometimes, when it's hard to let go, it

It's a good idea to talk to your children about fire safety, how to avoid starting fires, and what to do if there's a fire in your home.

Children as young as five can learn what to do in a fire emergency. This is lifelong learning that they will take into adulthood. Children also need to understand that fire can be dangerous.

Talking about what to do in an emergency

If a fire starts in a room, a person has about 3 minutes to get out before the

room is engulfed in smoke or flames that will kill them.

Teach your children to get out and stay out if there's a fire. If they see a fire or hear a smoke alarm, tell them to:

Get out of the house FAST (using your escape plan)

• Shout "Fire Fire Fire!"

 Go to the safe meeting place that you have practiced going to with your children

When talking about fire, children might ask about people dying in fire emergencies. You should provide truthful answers without making the child afraid.

You can tell your child about firefighters and how they rescue people in fires. However, sometimes firefighters might not arrive in time to rescue everyone. A fire can also be burning so fiercely that it's not possible to rescue people.

That's why it's so important to have



smoke alarms and an escape plan to know what to do in a fire. Remember, get out, stay out.

With the start of daylight savings don't forget to test your smoke alarm by pressing the button to sound the alarm. Remember you can't smell smoke while you are asleep.

Activity levels and prices impacted by lockdown

Median prices for residential property across New Zealand increased by 25.5% from \$677,400 in August 2020 to a record \$850,000 in August 2021, according to the latest data from the Real Estate Institute of New Zealand (REINZ).Auckland again underpinned the strength in the New Zealand median, hitting a record median house price in August of \$1,200,000 - up 26.4% from \$949,500 in August 2020. This growth was reflected throughout the region with 5 out of 7 districts reaching new record median prices – Rodney District (\$1,280,000), Manukau City (\$1,157,000), Waitakere City (\$1,120,000), Franklin District (\$950,000) and Papakura District (\$940,000).

House prices have once again risen across the country, with every region seeing a year-on-year increase from August 2020. This latest lockdown has not dampened demand for, or confidence in, the housing market as we saw in early 2020.

Auckland has seen another record median price, the ninth record in the last 12 months – this growth is spread across the region with five of the seven districts reaching new record median prices in August.

While value is up, volume is down, with the number of residential properties sold in August across New Zealand decreased by 26.5% when

compared to the same time last year (from 7,828 to 5,753) – this was the fewest properties sold for an August month since 2014. In Auckland, the number of properties sold in August decreased by 12.8% year-on-year (from 2,689 to 2,346).

With a scarcity of properties available to purchase in this market and the previous limitations of level4 and level3 lockdowns, the market is set for a crazy ride of low stock numbers and insatiable demand, so don't hold out for bargains in the next six months, it's the fast and the furious out there.

Interest deductibility rules for property investors

Tax Deductions for interest expenses on rental properties will be restricted from 1 October 2021. This would mean that if you acquire a residential investment property on or after 27 March 2021 interest will not be tax deductible from the income you earn on your investment. The interest deductibility for residential investment properties acquired before 27 March 2021 will gradually be phased out between 1 October 2021 and 31 March 2025.

However, new builds will be exempt from these interest deductibility rules. For instance, if the property got its code compliance certificate on or after 27 March 2020 the interest will be deductible for up to 20 years from the time that the code compliance certificate is issued. The exemption will apply to both the initial purchaser of the property as well as any subsequent owner within the 20 year period.

For people looking to buy property as an investment, these may be important factors to consider. We recommend that before buying or selling a property that you obtain advice from a property lawyer. How to react to rising mortgage rates?

Property Titles

The New Zealand property system offers indefeasible title which means you have a right or title in property that cannot be made void, defeated or cancelled by any past event, error or omission in the title. There are different types of Title. The best form of Title is a Fee Simple Title and you can use the land as you please (provided you comply with Council Bylaws). The title for town houses and apartment buildings are Strata or Unit Titles. These can deal with as few as two units or a complex of apartments in a multi-level building. A Unit Title is ruled by the Body Corporate



which establishes their own set of rules for occupants to abide by, and charges a levy for the building maintenance, insurance and administration costs. A Leasehold Title is a right to occupy for which rent is paid and you lease the property.

Another common form of title are fee simple cross-leases which are a hybrid of the fee-simple title and the leasehold title. You own two interests in the property. Firstly a share of the fee simple title in common with the other cross leaseholders; and a leasehold interest in the particular area and building that you occupy.

The rights of each owner depend not on settled legal rules, but on the terms of the particular lease. The lease is of only the original building site. In the building is altered/extended a new flats plan needs to be deposited and new leases registered otherwise an owner has no lease of any addition - horizontal or vertical - provided they are fully attached and fully enclosed. When the owner comes to sell, the existence of such additions are a defect in title. This can only be remedied by the expensive process of cancelling the lease and replacing it by a lease that includes the addition. A lack of general awareness that this is the legal position leads quite innocent vendors and purchasers into trouble.

Sharing the cost of your fence with your neighbour

The Fencing Notice - By Nathan Tetzlaff.

The Fencing Act 1978 provides that neighbours must each pay half the cost to do work on an adequate fence. This includes building a fence where there isn't one, replacing a damaged fence, or doing repairs. Neighbours can often agree on these matters without further assistance. Any agreement is enforceable and may be registered as a fencing covenant on the properties' titles.



Even if the neighbour has agreed, a fencing notice should then be handed to them (or

be sent to them by registered post) and should include reference to: The boundary to be fenced; The type of fence proposed; Who and how the fence would be constructed; The estimate of costs; and When the work will be done.

The notice should also be clear that your neighbour has 21 days to serve a 'cross notice' or else they will be deemed to have accepted the terms in the fencing notice, including liability to pay the amount proposed.

Central's Tips November 2021



Time to plant melons, pumpkin and corn, beans and salad greens.

It's also time to stake up tomatoes, cucumbers and beans and add some summer colour by planting flowers into your garden and in hanging baskets.

The fruit and vegetable garden

- If there's room, sow corn and plant out melons and pumpkins in well composted soil. Plant a climbing bean at the base of each corn plant, the plant acts as support for the beans and they grow happily together. Try planting pumpkins in the same area as a groundcover
- It's time to sow French or runner beans if you don't have a large frame for them to climb on get dwarf varieties and grow on bamboo hoops or small teepees.
- Plant basil beneath tomato plants it's a gardening marriage made in heaven. Putting in a few marigolds alongside helps keep pests at bay too
- Keep a regime of liquid feeding and watering going during this growth period. Placing pea straw around plants in the vegetable garden helps limit evaporation
- Stake, tie up or train climbing plants along wires. Tomatoes, cucumbers, beans and zucchini can be grown like this, and it aids production in a small space
- Keep those summer salads going by planting salad greens such as lettuce, mesclun, radish and spring onions frequently

Spring harvests

Harvest spinach, spring onions, lettuce and broccoli. Strawberries are ripening too so keep an eye on those. Use bird netting to make sure you eat them before the birds do!



The ornamental garden

- Hanging baskets are easy: place a plastic saucer in the base of the basket to help hold water, fill with good potting mix and pop in the summer flowering plants. Liquid feed after planting and hang in a sheltered, sunny spot, watering and feeding regularly
- Plant hostas, astilbes, clivias, renga renga lilies and pulmonarias in shady areas of the garden, to brighten dark areas. Keep the slug bait around them while they establish
- After flowering keep an eye on the foliage of kowhai trees – this is the time when the voracious kowhai caterpillar starts munching. Spraying with a control (organic or chemical) will help keep the leaves in place
- Drought proof plants for pots Geraniums, pelargoniums and succulents need very little watering to survive, perhaps once a week at most. Just plenty of sun.
- **Petunias are star performers for summer colour.** Plant in a sunny position in the garden or grow in pots or hanging baskets

Woolly nightshade

Woolly nightshade is a spreading, capsicum-smelling shrub or small tree growing up to 10m tall, with all parts covered in dusty hairs, and whitish, branching, soft-woody stems. It was originally from South America. Velvety, oval, grey green leaves are whitish underneath with prominent 'ears' at the base which clasp



the stem. It is usually quite easy to spot as it is paler than surrounding plants. Dense clusters of mauve to purple flowers with yellow



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anthers are visible year-round and are followed by clusters of round berries that ripen from hard green to soft, dull yellow.

It is a nasty weed and spreads quickly, forming dense stands which crowd out other plants. Even though the berries are poisonous to people, kererū and other birds can safely eat them, spreading seeds over large areas through their droppings. Each plant produces thousands of seeds, which also fall and grow around parent plants. The dust from the leaves and stems can irritate the skin, eyes, nose, and throat. Woolly nightshade grows in a large range of areas locally, including gullies, roadsides, farms, and wasteland, all well as urban areas – anywhere that birds visit. Tips for a great lawn over Christmas

Spring has arrived and with it the grass has taken off - it's thick and lush. When freshly cut it's a pleasure to walk over. To be sure it is ready for the summer use, there are a few things you can do. Have a look at your lawn. Do you have any thistles? What about Onehunga weed prickles? They can really spoil your enjoyment of your lawn. Is the grass looking good or do you have dandelions, daisies and other weeds popping up? What about the grass itself? Have you let it go a bit over the last few months - maybe it needs a bit of a pick-me-up.

Now's the time to take action for a beautiful summer lawn. Start now

and those annoying thistles and weeds can be gone and your lawn look and feel lush and beautiful when you want to be out and about on it.

Start with a targeted flat weed spray to kill those weeds (but not the grass), and then maybe a de-thatch to remove excess thatch, a little grass seed in any holes where the weeds were and then fertilise the whole lawn to promote healthy regrowth. Then arm yourself with some Onehunga weed spray and you can spray out that annoying pest before the little yellow flowers and then prickles start to appear.

If it's got away on you and is looking ready for the hay baler. It'll take several good mows to get it back under control – don't cut too much off the first time as you will remove all the green leaf and the plant will suffer due to a limited ability to feed itself, and it'll look brown and stalky. Use 3 or 4 mows in a short period of time to progressively lower the height and the grass will adjust to the new height. Then remember the lawn golden rule – little and often.

If you or your kids love to have bbq's, games of badminton or cricket, a bit of back-lawn camping, or just general running around on the grass, then these straightforward treatments and mowing tips will see your lawn thrive and be that ready for you to enjoy through your summer.



Time for a switchboard upgrade?

Is it time to upgrade your electrical switchboard?

Electrical switchboards - while they're usually out of sight, out of mind, hidden in a cupboard or tucked away in your laundry, they play an important role in your home - switchboards are the 'control panel' for your home's electrical system.



Our homes are now running more appliances than ever before, and older switchboards are not designed to handle the high-wattage loads of homes today. This can cause problems like overheating and the danger of fires or electrical accidents.

From computers, air conditioning units, and home theatre systems, to kitchen appliances, spa pools, and stereos, it's essential that your switchboard can handle the amount of electricity required by your household.

Here is a simple list of common signs that indicate you need a switchboard upgrade:

1. Appliances short-circuiting: Older switchboards have a tendency to 'trip' or short-circuit when they are overloaded. This is a mechanism designed to protect the circuit from overheating and resulting in an electrical fire.



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2. Flickering lights: While flickering lights may be caused by loose lightbulbs that need to be tightened, they can also be due to loose wiring in an old or damaged switchboard.

3. An overcrowded appearance: If your switchboard's wiring looks overcrowded, it probably needs upgrading. This is particularly important if you plan on introducing additional devices to your home such as spa pools or air conditioning units. These require dedicated circuits to power them and prevent your switchboard from overloading.

4. Your Switchboard still has fuses: Ceramic fuses are outdated and are a sign that your electrical system is at risk. While they function the same as a modern-type circuit breaker (shutting power off in the event of short circuit or overload), they cannot do it at the same speed - And the faster the power is terminated, the less damage will be done.

An upgrade of your switchboard is not a big investment for the sake of your family's safety.

Rhododendrons at Awa Nursery

A Rhododendron bush is very attractive, especially when in

Rhododendrons do well with direct light for at least part of the day and prefer dappled shade rather than excessive shade. Protection from the wind is also preferred. Ideally soil should be well-drained, humus-rich, and acidic (pH4.5-6). The Rhododendron has shallow root systems and needs moist soil and mulch to keep them from drying out. Be sure not to pile the mulch right up to the trunks though. The mulch will help in keeping the soil moist and cool, provides nourishment, and limits weed growth. Prune your Rhododendron after it has bloomed to shape your plant and remove any damaged branches. Kanika Park Cat Retreat

The cat (Felis catus) is a domestic species of small carnivorous mammal. It is the only domesticated species in the family Felidae and is often referred to as the domestic cat to distinguish it from the wild members of the family. A cat can either be a house cat, a farm cat or a feral cat; the latter ranges freely and avoids human contact. Domestic cats are valued by humans for companionship and their ability



to hunt rodents. About 60 cat breeds are recognised by various cat registries

The cat is similar in anatomy to the other felid species: it has a strong flexible body, quick reflexes, sharp teeth and retractable claws adapted to killing small prey. Its night vision and sense of smell are well developed. Cat communication includes vocalisations like meowing, purring, trilling, hissing, growling and grunting as well as cat-specific body language. A predator that is most active at dawn and dusk (crepuscular), the cat is a solitary hunter but a social species. It can hear sounds too faint or too high in frequency for human ears, such as those made by mice and other small mammals.

Lockdown blues

Where once our dogs had been happy and comfortable around family members some may start to move away, many may became more attention seeking and because of our stress levels and uncertainty our dogs can pick up on our feelings and change as well. Just like us our dogs like to have time alone and if we don't give our dogs space we may see some aggressive behavioural changes.

Please remind your children that if your dog moves away and is



trying to rest, leave it alone. Give them comparisons such as if they are watching their favourite TV programme and someone keeps interrupting them or annoying them how does it make them feel.

Tips for all:

A wagging tail - many of us have been told that this is a sign that the dog is happy. Unfortunately this is not always true. Research has shown us the tail wagging shows that the dog is engaging with something in its environment. They could be engaging in a positive or negative way. The Dog Safe Workplace has videos of aggressive dogs with their tails wagging.

Rolling on its back - again many of us think this is because they want their belly rubbed. Again not true. They are actually telling us that they are scared and small so please don't hurt me.

Bringing you their toy - yes they are showing you their toy and want you to play with them. Not always true. They may want you to play with them. Though this is not always the case and if you go to take the toy or pick up the ball they may try to snatch it back which could result in a bite. Also there may be certain rules that need to be followed or commands given when playing with that particular dog.

Hibiscus and Rose Tea Jelly Tip ice creams

A perfect recipe for those warmer summer days that are on their way to us.

The flavour from the hibiscus flowers and rose buds in the jelly part of this ice cream are really quite stunning and delicious. You could use any tea flavours you like to make



the jelly, or even use wine, cider or kombucha along with tea.

Jelly ingredients: 3/4 cup water, 1 Trose buds (heaped), 1 Thibiscus flowers (heaped), 2 T maple syrup, 2 1/2 teaspoons cornflour to thicken the mixture.

Ice cream ingredients: 175g frozen banana (approximately 2 medium bananas), 162g (approx.) frozen pineapple juice (take 1 tin of pineapple pieces, strain the juice off and freeze in ice cube trays, use all of the frozen juice), 2/3 cup coconut cream, 80g pineapple pieces, 1 T icing sugar (this makes an excess of ice cream which can be frozen for future use or made into a daiquiri by adding some Bacardi).

Chocolate coating ingredients: 2T dark cocoa, 2T maple syrup, 4 T coconut oil, (or for a richer and thicker coating, try Whitakers 72% dark chocolate instead).

Method - jelly: 1) Make the tea by adding the boiled water to the hibiscus and rose buds in a heat proof jug. 2) Stir and allow to steep



for 5-10 minutes, then strain and add the tea to a small pot, along with the maple syrup and bring to a boil. 3) In a small dish, add 2 teaspoons (approximately) of cold water to the corn flour and mix well. 4) Turn the heat down on the stove and stirring the tea vigorously, slowly pour in the corn flour mixture. 5) Keep stirring until the mixture becomes clear and thickens. 6) Remove from the heat and allow to cool to a luke-warm temperature. 7) Divide the mixture between four ice block moulds and freeze while you make the ice cream.

Method - ice cream: 1) Add all of the ingredients to a high-speed blender and on a low setting, carefully blend everything until it is well combined. You'll need to use the tamper to push the mixture down into the blades as it will become very thick. 2) Spoon the mixture on top of the jelly mixture in the ice block moulds. 3) Add your ice block stick to each ice cream at this point. 4) Return to the freezer and freeze for several hours or until hard.

Method - chocolate coating: 1) Melt the coconut oil, then add the maple syrup and cocoa powder. Mix well. 2) Have a baking tray lined with tin foil ready to go so you can place the coated ice creams on there. (Due to the tricky nature of the chocolate coating and the melting ice cream, you may have to keep the tray in the freezer and 'ferry' each newly coated ice cream to the freezer). 3) Run the ice block moulds under hot water to loosen them, and carefully pry them out as you need them. 4) Spoon the chocolate coating over the ice cream until it is well covered. 5) Freeze until ready to eat.

Notes: If the jelly tip falls off the ice cream when you attempt to chocolate coat it, simply sit it back on top of the ice cream and gently push it together. The chocolate will help to hold it in place.

The NAC of staying healthy

N-Acetyl cysteine (NAC) has a "gazillion" health benefits. Ranging from improving mental health to fighting viral infections and much more in between. Which makes it interesting in today's environment of high stress caused by a viral pandemic.



Mental Health:

Preventing post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) is one of NACs likely mental health benefits. And most of us are experiencing some form of stress currently. NAC has also shown benefits in helping with age-associated memory impairment, manic depression, obsessivecompulsive disorder, Parkinson's disease, and schizophrenia.

What about the immune system benefits?

"Google" NAC and Covid and you will get a heap of information on the effectiveness of NAC which I haven't had time to properly review. However, I am aware that NAC may improve the function of many immune cells like white blood cells such as lymphocytes, neutrophils, and phagocytes. There have been studies showing benefits in influenza and AIDS.

The Respiratory System:

NAC may produce benefits in preventing and treating acute respiratory distress syndrome. It has also been used in conditions such as asthma, bronchitis, pneumonia, and pulmonary fibrosis. It breaks down mucous in the lungs which makes it quite helpful.

I have even read somewhere that when applied to the skin it can prevent wrinkles.

The human body makes it for its own use. To do this, you need to eat adequate amounts of protein and the supportive nutrients like the B vitamins. But you can take extra NAC in capsules, in powdered

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form, or intravenously.

Hospitals use intravenous NAC to treat paracetamol overdose. The reason they use it in intravenous form is that NAC has a slight, sulphur-like flavour which many people don't like.

You must be careful about your source of NAC, as it only has to meet food standards which are not as high as medicine standards, and it is very susceptible to moisture.

Post script: Supplies of NAC are currently depleted if you were thinking of supplementing with this. We can provide you with alternative suggestions for your health. 

Leg muscle cramping

Do you suffer from muscle cramps? Do you frequently get a night cramp which affects your quality of sleep? Can't figure out how to relieve your pain? We may be able to help you!

What causes muscle cramp? A muscle cramp is defined as a sudden, painful and involuntary muscle contraction which commonly occurs in our feet and calves (but can happen in a wide range of muscles).

There are many causes of muscle cramp including:Underlying medical conditions, Certain medications e.g., Diuretics,



antipsychotics, birth control pills, statins, and steroids, Old age, Lifestyle changes, Muscle strain/overuse/imbalance, Diet, Dehydration, Low levels in certain minerals e.g., calcium, potassium, sodium, and/or magnesium, Pregnancy, Alcoholism, Muscle fatigue, Muscle weakness.

Treatment options - There are a couple of simple ways to prevent muscle cramp and relieve the pain when it does occur. Muscle stretching before and after doing exercise and before going to bed, drinking plenty of water, regular Epsom salt baths (helps to relax muscles), using ice or a wheat pack after exercise, and elevating legs using a pillow underneath.

Usually, muscle cramp can last from anywhere between a few seconds to a few minutes and is usually harmless; however, it can indicate some major health concerns like deep vein thrombosis, peripheral neuropathy, myositis, nerve compression, and restless legs syndrome.

If you continue to have muscle cramps, give the team at the Hobsonville Podiatry a call on 09 390 4184. They can do some physical assessments such as palpation of pulses, neurological sensation tests, deep tendon reflexes, and muscle strength to rule out any major health conditions then provide appropriate treatment.

Tips for practicing outdoor yoga

Days are getting brighter, warmer and longer with each passing day as we head towards our beloved Kiwi summer months.

In these changing and uncertain times, heading outside, connecting with some familiar, friendly faces and getting an hour of mindful breath and movement is one of the best things you can do for yourself.

Yoga Mat vs Something Else

On surfaces like grass and sand:

• Yoga mat - can bunch up because the

ground may be uneven. Unless you have a dedicated outdoor yoga mat, your favourite mat will likely get quite dirty. You may like to put a towel underneath.

• No mat - Grass and sand surfaces are already grippy. It is amazing to feel and sense the actual earth beneath you when you're outside.

• Towel or Blanket - great to protect yourself from the chill or dampness of the ground.

On surfaces like concrete, wooden deck spaces and hard surfaces,

• Yoga mat will be useful and won't become dirty as other surfaces.

In any case, it is very helpful to bring a spare towel can keep your





mat clean and also give your ankles, knees and wrists some extra padding. Experiment with options to find what works best for you. Is Outdoor Yoga the same as Indoor Yoga?

Your experience outdoors vs in-studio may be quite different for the

following reasons:A variable surface can bring new challenges with balance; that's a positive in our eyes.

• Outdoor yoga is often held in public spaces, meaning you will encounter people walking by, going on runs, bike rides and walking their dogs. Naturally, these people will be curious.

• It can be difficult to hear your teacher outdoors. If you're hard of hearing and know this could be a problem, arrive early for a suitable spot.

• Bring appropriate layers to make sure you're comfortable in the sun, under clouds, or with a breeze.

• Having some emergency bug repellant might be handy.

Something else to consider with an outdoor yoga practice; the wrists stabilise differently against a soft, grassy surface. You may want to consider modifying your practice to avoid unwanted pressure on the wrists. Perhaps take a child's pose where you'd normally flow to plank.



The lowdown on protein powders

We all know how important protein is and I have written about this before.

To recap, we need protein for the structure of our body for the growth, maintenance and repair of all our tissues and to transport our nutrients to our cells. It is a fundamental part of our immune system making antibodies and other substances that fight infections. It helps to ensure the fluids in our body stay balanced so we



don't swell up. It is also a building block of some hormones such as insulin and glucagon (both needed for blood sugar balance) and also leptin and ghrelin (needed for appetite and satiety control). It is required for the production of many neurotransmitters such as serotonin (happy), dopamine (pleasure), acetylcholine (focus) and it also gives us energy. If that's not enough, protein also helps with weight loss.

We get protein from meat, eggs, dairy, soy, legumes, grains, nuts and seeds and a small amount from some veggies. Does your business have a dysfunctional culture?

'Culture eats strategy for breakfast' is a famous quote from Peter Drucker. 'Happiness breeds success' is another common phrase. Is it true that a poor business culture will inhibit the ability for your business to grow and be successful? Let's look at some key themes.

What are some of the symptoms of a dysfunctional culture?

- High levels of staff turnover
- High levels of sick leave and leave without pay being taken
- Hesitancy in making decisions for fear of being wrong
- Bullying and low morale
- Lack of innovation and creativity



• Poor communication

Leadership style is important - There are many leadership styles, with some more suited to a particular situation. Some leaders may be more dominant, and others more influential. Whatever your style, the culture of the business is determined at the top, and permeates through the business.

Stephen Covey talks about the 7 habits of highly effective people. One of these habits is having a win/win mentality. This means that for every negotiation, both parties come out better off. If you are dealing with staff remuneration and hours worked, it might be that an employee has taken on additional responsibility (the business wins) and is rewarded with higher pay as well as a greater sense of achievement (the employee wins). It might be that flexible working hours are arranged; the employee get the benefit of the flexible hours, and the business gets the benefit of retaining the employee.

Employees want a safe place to work. This is more than following physical safety guidelines, but providing an emotionally safe place to work. They want to know that their manager has got their back if something goes wrong, or if they need help. In a dysfunctional business a manager might blame the employee for the mistake and tell them to fix it. In a thriving business the manager might discuss with the employee what went wrong, and work with the employee to put into place steps to prevent the error from happening again. The importance here is that the manager takes the responsibility.

Grow your employees, not number of staff - If you want to grow your business, you must improve the capability of your employees. We are currently in an economy where labour availability is constrained and productivity is low. We want to keep our employees, and help them to improve their skills. This might take the form of on-thejob training, external training courses, or providing them with the technology they need to perform their role more efficiently. It also means giving employees a chance to learn and to take on more responsibility (effective delegation is important).

Enable healthy relationships - Let's face it, we often spend more time with our work colleagues than our family. If we don't get along with someone that we work with, we are less likely to stay in the job.

Allow time for staff to get to know each other. This doesn't just mean going bowling on a Friday night, but may include providing a break out area for staff to share lunch or morning tea, having the occasional Friday night social drinks, a shared lunch, a cake for someone's birthday (with time to eat it together), or a Christmas lunch or dinner. Understanding our colleagues at a personal level makes it easier to be sympathetic when they are simply having a bad day.

If there is still conflict, it is up to the manager to step in and facilitate a resolution that is going to provide a win / win solution for everyone.

Happiness breeds success - Where employees have a safe working



environment, are valued for their contributions to the business, and have a good relationship with their manager and colleagues, they are more likely to be happy at work. Employees who are happy at work are more likely to go above and beyond what is required, are more likely to come up with good ideas to help grow the business, and are less likely to leave, or work the bare minimum required to keep their job.

The return to the business is improved productivity, increased creativity, happy customers, and business growth.

Have a good look at the culture of your business. Do any of the signs of a dysfunctional business ring true for your company? Changing culture takes time, but it must come from the top.

Print versus digital - why print is still around

Over the past few years, the digital age has made a major impact on how business is done and how consumers are engaged. However, in the age-old battle of print versus digital, why is it that print still comes out on top?

Print Vs Digital and why readers keep coming back for more. Print media is surviving in spite of the predictions of some doomsayers. In fact, in a number of areas, it remains the preferred format. As the dust from digital's disruption begins to settle, print may be finding some safe footing once again. "Print has proved to be more resilient than people thought"

"I think there was an 'over-correction' three or four years ago, where people thought that everything must be digital, that print wasn't going to survive at all."

However, here we are in 2021 and print is nowhere near dead. So why is that? Print stimulates more senses - One exclusive quality that print has and the digital media can never match is just how tangible it is. Consumers are able to browse through a magazine, feel the paper and even distinguish between certain paper densities and compositions.

For example, one specific advert may be printed on a thicker, more porous paper that is easy to take notice of, compared to the rest of the glossy sheets in the magazine. Also, there's the smell of ink on paper that adds to the overall experience of reading something printed.



These are important senses that cannot be stimulated in the digital environment - or not yet, at least.

Complex information is also better absorbed in print than in digital, because people need to locate themselves in the text when looking at complex ideas – and that's much easier to do in print than in digital.

"Very often, when you read something from a printed magazine or book you can recall where on the physical page it was when you saw it - you can recall if you were two-thirds of the way through, or half of the way through," says Beare.

The tangibility that print has to offer also makes readers pay more attention to the content than digital does. This is because readers have to actively engage with printed content to read it - they have to pick up the content, hold it and read it. With digital content, they can passively scroll through it, without having to focus too much.

West Auckland charity funding shortfalls


Hundreds of charities and community groups are struggling to meet multimillion-dollar revenue shortfalls as the impact of COVID lockdowns continue - according to new figures.

A local initiative which offers \$1m in funding to charities and community organisations has had applications for over six times the amount of available funds this year.

New funding data shows the need is greatest amongst charitable organisations which provide social services on the front line of COVID - with community support groups making up over half (52%) of those that have been allocated funding this month.

Many of these groups require urgent financial support to cover operating overheads such as power, rent and insurance.

Local sporting organisations made up a fifth (21%) of those who will



receive critical funding, with environmental initiatives accounting for a seventh (14%) of applications and cultural groups making up the remaining 13%.

A record 259 charitable organisations and groups applied to receive a share of the million-dollar fund, a 50% increase over any previous year in the fund's history.

Allan Pollard, CEO of The Trusts, which established the Your West Support Fund, says that many of these organisations have relied on revenue from gaming foundations and other sources which have been heavily impacted by the lockdown.

"The volumes of funding applications we have had in recent months is far in excess of what we have experienced before.

"We know many of these organisations have relied on funding from gaming machines to help them meet the needs of those in the community they support, and the extended lockdown has effectively cut off this source of revenue overnight.

"As a result, the shortfall between what we can offer these organisations and what they have applied for is around \$5.6m - with significantly more unmet need in the wider community.

"Our understanding is one of the reasons for the unprecedented need for funding is the impact of COVID and the greater demand by our community for support from these charities," he says.

Pollard says his organisation set up a \$1 million fund, made up of profits from the business, to provide dozens of community groups with up to \$50,000 each towards projects which support those living in West Auckland.

He says while there is greater recognition of their organisation as a source of financial support in the region, the deficit among these groups this year is significantly greater than their resources can support.

"But what we are faced with is a substantial number of charities now wanting to access this resource with the total need much higher than we can meet as a single organisation.

"Along with charities which support our most vulnerable residents and sporting clubs there has been a significant increase in the number of applications from environmental and arts groups needing our support this year over previous years," he says.

Pollard says it is concerning to see the need jump six fold in just one year and says the ongoing effects of COVID are continuing to impact these charities and the communities they serve.

He says they expect to be able to distribute the million-dollar fund to the 130 successful applicant groups later this month and have focused on supporting local community groups that have few other funding sources.

"We have worked to allocate funding to help ensure the continuity of as many groups as possible.

"The impact of COVID it has seen a shift away from funding capital projects, events and those organisations with access to government funding and instead, helping our essential local groups meet their immediate day-to-day expenses so they can weather the ongoing impact of lockdowns in our region," he says.
