

Bowel Cancer: Early Detection Saves Lives

June in NZ marks Bowel Cancer Awareness Month, a vital time to shine a light on one of New Zealand's most common and preventable cancers. Every year, over 3,000 Kiwis are diagnosed with bowel or colon cancer, and sadly, it claims the lives of more than 1,200. Yet when detected early, it's highly treatable, and in many cases, curable. That's why awareness, education, and access to screening for early detection and diagnosis are so critical.

Why Early Detection Matters

The earlier bowel cancer is caught, the better the outcome. When diagnosed at an early stage, more than 90% of people will survive beyond five years. Unfortunately, many cases are not picked up until the disease is advanced, when treatment is more complex and outcomes are poorer. Regular screening can detect bowel cancer early - often before any symptoms appear - or even identify pre-cancerous growths or polyps that can be removed before they turn into cancer.

Know the Risk Factors

Bowel cancer can affect anyone, but certain factors may increase your risk. These include:

- Age: Most cases occur in people over 50. But note that there is a rise in early onset bowel cancer (age < 50) so you are "Never too young", to lend our support to Bowel Cancer NZ's campaign. If you are worried, you're never too young to get checked for early onset bowel cancer. For more resources check out: www.bowelcancernz.org. nz/never-too-young/

- Family history: Having a close relative with bowel cancer increases your risk.

- Diet and lifestyle: Diets low in fibre and high in red or processed meats, smoking, excessive alcohol, and a sedentary lifestyle can contribute to risk.

- Personal history: Individuals with inflammatory bowel disease (such as Crohn's disease or ulcerative colitis) are at greater risk.

Understanding these risks is the first step in taking control of your bowel health.

Symptoms to Watch For

From the Bowel Cancer NZ website, 45% of patients and survivor respondents were not aware of the symptoms of bowel cancer before they were diagnosed, and 33% of patients waited more than five months before seeing a doctor, thinking the symptoms would go away and weren't serious. As we reflect on this, it highlights the importance of knowing the symptoms but also taking action to get checked.

Though bowel cancer doesn't always cause symptoms right away, there are some warning signs to take seriously:

- A persistent change in bowel habits (diarrhoea, constipation, or narrower stools)

- Blood in your stool or on the toilet paper
- Unexplained weight loss
- Abdominal pain, bloating, or cramping
- A feeling that your bowel doesn't empty completely
- Fatigue or weakness, often caused by anaemia

If you notice any of these symptoms, talk to your doctor promptly. Don't delay - it's always better to check.

Screening Saves Lives

The National Bowel Screening Programme offers free testing for people aged 58 to 74, with plans to expand. The simple at-home test looks for hidden blood in your stool - a possible early sign of bowel cancer. If you receive an invitation, don't ignore it. Taking part in screening could save your life.

For those outside the programme's age range, with higher risk factors, or want the peace of mind of choosing your appointment time, Waitemata Endoscopy is able to offer a Colonoscopy appointment within 7 working days of a GP or self-referral when you let us match you with the availability of our 18 experienced specialists. 

Prepare your lawn for winter with STIHL SHOP Westgate

Your lawn is already naturally equipped to get through the cold season. However, with a proper lawn care routine, you can avoid being caught off guard by major or minor damage once spring comes around again.

1. Remove autumn leaf litter

The most important thing to do is properly clear your lawn before winter sets in. Remove leaf litter and fallen debris as this allows oxygen to circulate and prevents the cold-season mould and fungus that can develop in damp conditions making it vulnerable to pests and disease.

While this can be done manually with a rake, you can also do this task in half the time by using your lawn mower to help you. Remove any larger twigs beforehand, and make sure you've got your catcher on. Set your mowing height nice and high, and remember, it's easiest to mow leaves when they are not too thick on the ground and also when they are dry. Best not to do this after a week of rainfall.

Leaf litter that's covering your garden beds is actually fine where it is, provided it's not too dense. A thin layer will actually protect against frost, and will also provide a habitat for small garden creatures.

2. Feeding and rejuvenating

Feeding is an essential part of lawn care, and fertilisation in late autumn will give your lawn a dose of nutrients that will help it to survive the cooler weather. Opt for special fertilisers that will prepare your lawn for the low temperatures, frost, and moist air that come with the coldest months. Potassium is an important part of the fertiliser mix, as it helps your lawn to resist frost and disease and also has a beneficial effect on the metabolism of the grass.

3. Mowing height matters

Don't cut your lawn lower than around 5 cm. This will stimulate growth which is important before the cooler weather settles in and the rate at which your grass growth will slow.

4. The last cut of the season

Your last cut before winter should be a low one, as this



will reduce the risk of fungus taking hold. We recommend that you use your catcher for this mow, as leaving the grass cuttings on the ground may smother the surface of your lawn. Make sure you do this before the morning frost arrives, and on a dry day.

5. Care for your lawnmower

Another way to care for your lawn is to care for your lawn mower. Remember to give it a good clean after each use, as built up grass clippings can become stuck and difficult to remove. Inspect your blades too – sharp mower blades are vital to a healthy lawn.

Safer Community See a fire before it starts



Every year, as temperatures drop, we see a significant increase in the number of house fires.

At Fire and Emergency over the last 10 years, we have observed a 54% increase in heat source related house fires we've responded to in May-July compared to the rest of the year. The majority of these are caused by or related to the increased use of heat sources in winter, such as heaters, chimneys, ash disposal, electric blankets and dryers. Encouragingly, heat source related house fires have decreased by 7% in the past 3 years (compared with the prior 6 years). This has been a combination of effort by manufacturers and public awareness. Some of these factors include:


- Manufacturers required to have fail safe features
- More rigorous testing of approved heat sources
- A move to safer heating options (away from wood burners)
- More work by FENZ in pre-school and school programs
- More community interaction by Brigades to share safety messages

- More editorials in magazines like Kumeu Courier and The Westerly to get key messages through

Fire & Emergency's strategy

Our winter fire safety campaign 'See a fire before it starts' prompts people to better identify and decrease fire risks associated with the use of electric blankets, chimneys, heaters, dryers and hot ash disposal.

Using a thermographic imaging treatment, we're able show unsafe fire scenarios from a new perspective. This shift in focus demonstrates that danger is often hidden from the naked eye, but a fire is easily preventable if you know what to look for.



Our suggestions:

The Winter campaign encourages some key fire safety behaviours:

1. Check the heat before you sleep - Check your electric blanket for hot spots before first use

2. Chimney alright before first light? - Get your chimney cleaned

3. A metre from the heater - keep everything at a safe distance

4. Cool ash before you stash - soak with water in a metal bucket

5. A clean dryer avoids fire - remove lint before every use

6. A hungry rat can spark - rats eat wires, causing sparking, please bait or trap

Through this change in season please take a moment to ensure your home and your actions are safe and that you are not at risk of a fire that can be avoided. Rats in rural and lifestyle homes can cause significant damage in wiring, use bait, traps or high pitch plug in's to avoid costly damage.

Open fire season means there will be a bit more smoke in the area than usual, if you are lighting up, be sympathetic to neighbours and road users as smoke can be think and dense with wet vegetation piles.

Stay well, stay warm.

The importance of saying farewell




As the country has lived through the grip of the current recession, a key focus for all New Zealanders has been every increasing cost of living. Whether it is petrol and other utility costs, or just the daily

other. At Davis, we have had opportunity to witness the impacts of the inevitable complicated grief state that the absence of a farewell creates from family members who have attended our annual remembrance service we hold every December, says Powell. These people have told us that they have lived with the emotional discomfort of missing out on that final goodbye, and how they had wished they had done something at the time of their loved one's death.

In terms of relative costs, a funeral is considerably cheaper than other life event ceremonies such as weddings and provides a one time only opportunity to honour the life of somebody and say goodbye that final time.

Waimauku rider dominates dressage season



Waimauku-based dressage rider Wendi Williamson has dominated the 2025 equestrian season aboard New Zealand Hanoverian gelding Don Vito MH. She claimed major titles at the Defender Horse of the Year (HOY) in Hastings, the Bates NZ Dressage Championships in Taupo, and the Sydney CDI.

An environmental scientist, Wendi entered 2025 with high expectations after earning the ESNZ Rider of the Year and

the Lowry Medallion in 2024 for top all-round equestrian performance.

Her 2025 campaign began strongly with a sweep of the Grand Prix classes at HOY, defending her Dressage Horse of the Year title. She won the Harrison Lane FEI Grand Prix CDI3* (71.022%), the Grand Prix Special (72.341%), and the Grand Prix Freestyle (74.780%). These results surpassed her 2024 Freestyle score of 72.96%, signaling new personal bests and edging closer to elite international benchmarks.

At the Bates NZ Dressage Championships, Wendi and Don Vito MH again dominated the Grand Prix division, winning all three CDI3* tests and renewing their national champion status. While the Big Tour field was small, the pair continued to demonstrate top form. She also won the Elementary title on Furst Klass MH and the Advanced Medium on Danseur MH, showing her range as both rider and trainer.

All three horses are bred by Matthews Hanoverians, reinforcing Wendi's successful partnership with the breeder. She also took home both NZ Hanoverian Society Awards for Don Vito MH and Furst Klass MH.

Wendi concluded her season at the Sydney CDI, repeating her 2024 clean sweep. She won the CDI3* Grand Prix (67.109%), Grand Prix Special (65.553%), and Grand Prix Freestyle (73.3%), noting improvements in lightness and expression. She self-funded the trip again, joined by ESNZ High Performance Dressage Manager Christine Weal.

Wendi's standout 2025 season has further cemented her status in New Zealand dressage, strengthening her campaign toward future international goals including the World Championships and Olympic qualification.



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



Property Management Report

Residential rents are dropping around the country, while the number of rental properties being advertised is the highest it has been in more than 10 years.

According to the latest figures from Trade Me Property, the number of residential properties available to rent on the website in March/ April was up 41% compared to March last year, and at its highest point since early 2014.

At the same time, the national median weekly asking rent for the properties advertised on the website declined by \$5 a week in March from February (-0.8%). It was also \$15 a week lower (-2.3%) than March last year, giving tenants a saving of just under \$800 a year.

Auckland posted a -1.4% annual decline.

"Those seeking residential rental accommodation should feel empowered, there's a wider range of options available and tenants have more negotiating power than they have had in years", Trade Me Property Customer Director Gavin Lloyd said.

"With a rental market that's historically favoured landlords, the changing dynamics and cost saving benefits are sure to be warmly welcomed by renters," he said

North West Auckland has been hit with a continuing oversupply of townhouse stock which is compounding

with a lack of garaging and storage options. Therefore rental prices for this stock have reduced significantly in light of competition.

Can auction results tell us a story

Most Real Estate agents I talk with at the moment discuss the conservative and unconfident nature of the buyer community that are wanting an excellent house at an excellent price. Buyers are generally in no hurry to buy and have been looking for some time. One buyer I was talking with has been shopping for two years, which asks the question " how can auctions work if buyers are generally disinterested in committing, unless all aspects are in their favour to buy. We took a snapshot of auction activity in the North West in early May.

Waitakere District had 9 auction properties which resulted in no sales result. Rodney District had 15 auction properties which resulted in 3 sales resulting (with 1 making RV). Therefore, you have to ask the question, have we entered a new phase in the buyer cycle which follows FOMO (Fear of missing out) called FOC (Fear of commitment).

We are seeing people at open homes, many though are trying to understand the market, getting a sense of value and building a buying profile. This clearly is not possible with the auction process, with buyers wanting to buy on their terms and timeframe.

The next OCR (official cash rate) change is scheduled for 28th May 2025 with many predicting another reduction likely, albeit, measured given the global turmoil over tariffs and warring factions.

Banks are holding the 12-24 month fixed mortgage interest rates at 4.99% with a further reduction due post 28th May 2025.

We stay positive that the prices being paid for North West Real Estate today is at its lowest ebb and the lower interest rates will continue to firm up buyer activity and engagement, albeit slowly.

Refinancing your mortgage



If you are looking at moving your mortgage to another bank, we can help you with the legal side of things. Refinancing your residential lending from one bank to another requires a solicitor to be engaged who can discharge the current mortgage on your title and register the new one.

However, free money comes with a catch. If you repay the loan within a certain time, you might need to repay the cash incentive. The Bank will ask you to sign a cash contribution deed, and while each bank is a little bit different, by and large most lenders require you to repay a portion of the cash incentive if you repay your lending within three years from the date you borrowed the money. This might happen if you sell the property, or refinance with a new lender.

Trustee Troubles



Sometimes trustees of a trust could find themselves in a difficult position where

practical necessity requires that they act in a way that may conflict with their trustee

duties under the Trusts Act 2019. This could happen where, for example:

a house must be sold but a weak property market means that the trustees are

unlikely to get the best possible price for that house; or a trustee who is also a beneficiary wishes to be paid out their share of the Trust property, but it is unclear whether doing so could be unfair to other beneficiaries.

The difficulty for trustees is that their decisions could be challenged by beneficiaries

and potentially they could be held personally liable if found that they breached their

obligations as trustees. In these situations, trustees can apply to the Court for

permission to act in a particular way. By doing so, they will avoid any personal liability.

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



Why Experts Recommend Limiting Screen Time for Preschoolers

While screens are everywhere, experts warn that too much tech use in early childhood can hinder healthy development. Here's why it matters:

1. Brain and Language Development

Preschool years are critical for brain growth. Children who spend more than 1 hour of screen time daily show lower scores in language and thinking skills (NIH, 2019).

2. Social Skills

Face-to-face interaction teaches empathy and communication. Excessive screen use reduces these opportunities, limiting development of social and emotional skills.

3. Physical Health

Children under 5 should have at least 3 hours of physical activity daily (WHO), yet screen time often displaces movement. It also disrupts sleep due to blue light exposure.

4. Attention and Behavior

High screen exposure is linked to shorter attention spans and increased impulsivity. One study found preschoolers with more than 2 hours of screen time per day were 5 times more likely to exhibit behavioral problems (JAMA Pediatrics, 2019).

5. Risky Content

Even apps labeled "kid-friendly" can expose children to ads, violence, or addictive design. Without supervision, kids are at risk of seeing inappropriate content.

6. Creative Play Decline

Pretend play builds imagination and problem-solving skills. Screen use often replaces this vital, open-ended activity.

Bottom Line- Moderate, supervised tech use is okaybut young children thrive most through real-world play, movement, and human interaction.

Ask Dr. Heather



I've been wanting to have filler in my lips, but am feeling unsure. How do you make sure they look good? Anon, West Harbour

Luscious lips are something many of us desire, and multiple things should be

considered to ensure they look and feel good. It is natural to feel nervous, as there are a lot of overdone lips out there that are enough to scare even the bravest of souls (Married at First Sight anyone?).

As injectors we firstly have to take into account overall facial proportions and surrounding tissues. Lips should never look stuck on, so there must be adequate support from tissues around the mouth in order to achieve a natural result.

Correct filler choice (softer rather than firmer), injected at the correct depth (close to the skin surface) in the correct amount (not too much) and correct location (only in the pink area, also known as the "pink lip"), will ensure it looks natural.

Specific areas of deficiency, width of your nose and eyes, in conjunction with your own natural lip shape, ethnicity and lip projection will also help yield a lovely result where you look subtly enhanced, but still yourself.



Very few of us look good with large lips and none of us looks good with sausages. Harmony is key, so always see an injector who will respect this, so you look and feel like the best, most luscious version of you.

How alignment affects your health and movement



Posture is one of the first things people notice, and it affects far more than just your spine. Budget 2025

Budget 2025 is a no B.S. budget. It takes the next step in securing New Zealand's recovery, focusing on growth, services, and family support. With inflation easing, interest rates falling, and 240,000 new jobs forecast. Budget 2025 is a responsible plan to keep the country on track. Here's how we are delivering for Kiwis:

1- Delivering Law and Order

\$472 million over four years to expand Corrections capacity. We're funding 580 new staff, including 368 Corrections Officers. We are upgrading Christchurch Men's Prison with 240 new beds, a health Centre, and a 52-bed mental health unit.

2-Strengthening Health

We're delivering \$7 billion in new funding, and over \$1 billion in capital for health. This means more surgeries, longer prescriptions, improved GP access, and upgrades to several hospitals. We're delivering 21,000 additional treatments and 231,000 more GP visits.

3- Investing in Education

\$2.5 billion is going to expanded learning support. It means early intervention for Year 1 pupils, new Learning Support Coordinators to all primary schools, and investment for classrooms, maintenance, and teacher workforce development.

4- Investment Boost

A new tax incentive allowing 20 percent of new asset costs to be deducted immediately, lifting investment, productivity, wages, and cashflow across the economy.

5- Stabilising Disability Support

A \$240 million boost over four years for 7,000 people in residential care. We will introduce a new national pricing

Budget 2025 redirects \$21.4 billion in savings to frontline services, with restrained new spending and a surplus forecast by 2028-29. It balances growth and responsibility to help businesses, families, and communities get ahead.

Thin blue line turns black and blue

Bullying, intimidation, coercion, harassment, labels applied to NZ Police.

A report released by the Independent Police Conduct Authority labelled NZ Police as having WBullying, Intimidation, Coercion and Harassment culture and related Issues in New Zealand, the Authority found significant elements in some workplaces, and a related negative culture.

"This negative culture did not permeate every workplace", said Judge Colin Doherty, Chair of the Independent Police Conduct Authority. "The weight of evidence suggests it is confined to particular individuals, workplaces and districts. However, it was sufficiently prevalent to give rise to concern and points to the pressing need for change in management and organisational practice".

The report identifies seven distinct themes underlying interviewees' negative experiences: intolerance of questioning or dissent; favouritism and protectionism; marginalisation and ostracism; abuse and intimidatory conduct; sexist and racist behaviour; inappropriate office culture: and lack of empathy and caring. In many instances, the consequences of the bullying behaviour were profound, particularly in terms of the physical and mental health and wellbeing of staff.

Overall, however, the survey supports the Authority's findings and conclusions. It finds that 40% of respondents personally experienced (as distinct from merely observing) poor behaviour towards them over the past 12 months: 26% had experienced an isolated incident of abuse, bullying or harassment; and 9% had suffered sustained bullying.

"The underlying drivers of the culture reported to us tended to be directly related to the operating environment of policing and the lack of expertise of managers and supervisors, exacerbated by inadequate appointment and training processes", said Judge Doherty.

"Society has changing expectations and values, and behaviour which would have been regarded as acceptable, or at least tolerated, 20 years ago is now rightly regarded as inappropriate and oppressive. Police are not unique in needing to adapt to changing values."

The statements made by Judge Doherty have been echoed by many in the North West Community over the last 12 months with many community leaders feeling underwhelmed by Police support, lack of engagement and an organisation that prioritises tickets over long term tangible police benefits. Further feedback suggested Police within the area are under-experienced to make complex decisions or assess appropriate engagement to ensure a favourable community outcome. With NZ Police still endeavouring to meet recruitment targets while bleeding experienced officers to Australia it is unlikely that a remedy to fix the underlying culture and behavioural issues will arrive any time soon. Distance families: Dual passports - an extraordinary gift



Adventure, love, or both often lead Kiwis to settle abroad in their partner's country. These migrants courageously build new lives far from home.

Their children grow up as locals-accents and all. Grandchildren with Kiwi heritage know they're "half something else." Some

embrace this early; others grow into it. When young, their identity is usually rooted in the country they live inwhich is perfectly natural. Still, the migrant parent and grandparents back in New Zealand often hope the Kiwi connection deepens over time.

One important milestone is gaining a second passport. Not all countries allow dual citizenship, so it's a special gift. New Zealand does. Young kids enjoy the novelty, but only later realise the value-access to resident university tuition in NZ, cheaper or free medical care when visiting, easier Gap Year options, or faster immigration lines.

NZ passports recently increased to \$247 for adults and \$144 for children. Applications from outside NZ are slightly cheaper, as they exclude GST. Standard processing takes about four weeks.

Urgent renewals, processed in three working days, double the adult fee to \$494 and nearly triple the child cost to \$391. However, urgent renewals aren't available if applying from overseas. Many countries require six months' validity on your passport for entry. If you have family overseas, it's wise to keep your passport current, with that six-month buffer built in. If you need to travel unexpectedly, you'll be ready.

Netsafe New Zealand



At a time when there are discussions about restricting social media to younger children, it's worth looking at Netsafe's suggestions to support parents and guardians to help teens

navigate TikTok, the popular social media platform that allows users to create, share, and discover short videos. Netsafe is New Zealand's independent, non-profit online safety organisation. Like many media platforms that publish user generated content, TikTok serves as an outlet for creative expression (through singing, dancing, comedy and lip-syncing) as well as political activism, hobbyist and expert content from health to finance, enabling users to share videos within a community or discover new content based on what they already like to watch (using algorithms).

The minimum age for TikTok is 13, and for users between 13 and 15, accounts are private by default. Accounts for users over 16 years old are public by default, meaning anyone on the app can view or interact with the shared content.One can find a lot of entertaining and enjoyable content on TikTok. However, sometimes people post videos that contain distressing content that may not be comfortable to see. TikTok has partnered with Netsafe to create a guide to help parents and teens to work together to develop a safety agreement for watching TikTok. Go to netsafe.org.nz to download the TikTok guide.

You can also go to the Adults section on the Netsafe site to find an excellent programme on Media Literacy to learn about topics such as "How can I know it's true?" "Misinformation" "What can we trust?" and so on.

"Splashing Colours on the Railway Corridor!"

Local West Harbour artist, Lucia Laubscher, is splashing colours on her largest canvas yet! Late last year, KiwiRail kicked off their pilot project to beautify the railway corridor around Auckland. They identified graffiti hot spots and transformed these eyesores into eye candies with various beautiful murals. Graffiti is a widespread issue across the network, and the aim with this project is to brighten things up with community-inspired murals that hopefully will help prevent tagging.

The CPNZ Patrol has just held its AGM and the reports for the previous 12 months have been one of the biggest since the inception of the Community Patrol nine years ago, then named Massey Community Patrol. A total of 14,212 kms were clocked up on the two patrol vehicles. The volunteer patrols gave 1620 hours of patrol time. Eight new patrollers have joined the Patrol in that 12 month period, which is very encouraging after Covid had hit most volunteer organisations very hard. The answer from the majority of the new recruits as to why they wanted to join was "I want to give back to my community and make it a safer place to live and work". The Patrol has worked very closely with the NZ Police and Neighbourhood Support Waitakere in several community projects and events. Safer Plates is a monthly event where number plate screws are changed out to tamper resistant screws. Patrol members were also mobilised at the call for assistance to join in the search for missing persons. The next 12 months looks to be even bigger with more volunteer patrollers, equating to more patrols out across the west. A specialised vehicle joins the fleet in July, giving us more capacity to carry required equipment for a variety of situations. Patrollers will continue to receive further training and education from our partner emergency organisations. Lincoln Heights School

At Lincoln Heights School, kai is more than food - it's a living philosophy grounded in culture, connection, and care for the environment.

With support from Healthy Families Waitākere, the school has embraced the Mana Motuhake o te Kai (MMotK) framework as part of its journey through Kāhui Māra Kai – a wider movement to embed food sovereignty and local leadership in everyday spaces. The school's māra kai (food garden) has become a vibrant outdoor classroom where tamariki learn to grow, harvest, and care for the whenua - deepening their connection to whakapapa, leadership, and kaitiakitanga. "It's not just about what tamariki learn - it's about the values they carry and the relationships they build with the whenua, their communities, and their culture," says kaimahi Augustine Kopa, who supports the kaupapa alongside teacher Jen Harris.

Now in its fourth year, the initiative is thriving. After a recent wananga with Christian Curtis, Systems Innovator at Healthy Families Waitākere, the school is expanding its use of MMotK beyond the mara kai. Under Harris's leadership, the environmental group has grown to over 60 students. Together, they care for the local Huruhuru stream, exploring ecosystem health through both western science and te ao Māori. "We're nurturing a connection to whenua and to one another," says Harris. The school now looks to deepen its connections with iwi, kaumātua, and community experts to further ground the kaupapa in local mātauranga.

Off-leash dogs on sports fields pose serious risk to children and players



A recent dog attack during a football training session at Tahurangi / Crum Park has highlighted the serious risk off-leash dogs pose to our communities. A young girl, watching football training with family members, was attacked by an uncontrolled dog. She will be left with a large scar and a life-long traumatic memory because of this preventable incident.

Auckland Council's General Manager for Licensing and Compliance, Robert Irvine says this is not an isolated

Chair of the Regulatory and Safety Committee Councillor Josephine Bartley, herself a dog lover and owner, says our bodies. it's unacceptable to have dogs running uncontrolled across our playing fields. "Dogs must be always kept Microplastics found in human blood for first time under control near playing fields. This sort of thoughtless www.brusselstimes.com behaviour has serious consequences; let's keep our sports grounds safe, clean, and enjoyable for everyone."

Auckland Council's regional rule states that dogs are not allowed on most sports playing surfaces at any time. This includes marked football pitches. These areas are for organised sport and recreation - not dog exercise. Dogs may still be allowed away from playing surfaces, including on a leash on the sidelines when sport is being played.



Microplastics


We are surrounded by plastic. It's a light, flexible and durable wonder-material, and has revolutionised our world. Our food and drink comes in it, household items are made of it, our floors are covered in it, we wear it. Plastic appears inert, but in fact the over 9000 types of plastics we now have contain a myriad of chemicals, which can leach out.

New research is concerning. Microplastics have been found in human lung tissue, breast milk, placental tissue, and blood. Studies on mice show that microplastics cause inflammation, damage the gut microbiome, lower sperm quality and testosterone levels, and impact learning and memory. Research on the effects of plastics in humans is only beginning.

There's no point panicking, but there are things we can do to reduce our exposure:

Dust and vacuum regularly and ventilate your home well. Next time you need to change your carpet, get wool instead of synthetic. Use an air purifier if you have one.

In time we will find out more about how microplastics will affect us. Meanwhile, we can all do our bit to reduce the number of microplastics entering our environment, and
