What's it really like being a funeral director?



As funeral directors we get asked a lot of questions, we thought that in this issue we would try to answer some of the more common ones.

- What do people often get wrong or misunderstand

about funeral directors?

A funeral director's role is to take the journey with those impacted by the death of someone close, and to attend to the practicalities of looking after the deceased and ensuring they receive a dignified and respectful farewell. We do not sell funerals. Our role is to take the time to get to know every family we have the privilege of serving, developing an understanding of their needs be it cultural, religious, or just simply their wants. In response we use our experience to present them with options and ideas as to how they can achieve the desired farewell outcome. This allows the family to make an informed decision which will support their mourning and grief journey.

- What drew you into the funeral industry?

In hindsight it was only a matter of time before I acquiesced to the lure of the funeral industry. As a much younger man, and having worked after hours as secondary employment, in a funeral home, aside of being a great part time job then, offering regular work, it certainly made me aware of both the value and fragility of life, but further the significant role funeral directors assume, both looking after the deceased and guiding and assisting those who are left behind.

- Has the industry itself changed, for example with the embracing of tech?

Like any industry, the funeral industry needs to continually adapt and meet the ever-changing needs of its clients. In the backend of the business, we have replaced paper with systems to support us in delivering better service to families, but also to bring together our ecosystem of suppliers and drive efficiency and the reduction of errors. More importantly, we continue to see a shift to the everbroadening and varied farewells that families want. A key part of this is the growing dependence on technology.

People lead busy lives. The global population has never been so mobile, and technology provides a vital link for those who cannot be present to attend the farewell. I see this trend continuing to grow and we respond by delivering capabilities to enable fully immersive services anywhere.

- What's the most meaningful or memorable service you've been involved in?

Now that takes some thought, although, I can think of a funeral that I looked after for a person who went missing, presumed dead after a number of months of remaining unfound. The family were insistent that they join friends, school mates, colleagues past and present of the deceased to give thanks for the deceased's life. Beyond human optimism and the guilt of holding a funeral when the deceased could still be alive. I have never in my career as a funeral director seen such an outpouring of disbelief and grief.

- Davis is involved in a lot of community support - could you tell us about that and why it's important to you?

Whilst there is no hiding the fact that Davis' primary business is looking after families when they lose someone close, equally we want to ensure that we support communities to help people enjoy the best quality of life they can. We achieve this in a number of ways, notably through financially supporting foundations reliant on fundraising including partnering with Mercy Hospice, Totara Hospice, Hospice West Auckland and The Starship Foundation. In addition to financial support, the Davis team volunteer and engage in community outreach activities including training and awareness. We also financially support a number of sporting clubs, and of course not forgetting, our valued partnership with the Auckland Philharmonia, which in turn provides us the opportunity to give the gift of music through concerts both public and private throughout the year.

"Tony and I moved to Scott Point in July 2021, just before lockdown, and I quickly noticed the potential for improving our local area. After months of planting, weeding, and watering, I reached out to

We've since organised planting days with local schools, posted on Facebook, and handed out leaflets to get more people involved. Since Annette Mitchell took over Habitat Hobsonville two years ago, we've planted over 1,600 native plants, regularly weeded and mulched, and received generous support through free mulch from Mulch King. Students from Scott Point Primary and Hobsonville Point High have helped, along with corporate groups. When Martha-Louise was living on a kibbutz milking cows in Israel, the last thing she thought she would be doing vears later was opening her own funeral home. An avid traveller who is passionate about animals and caring for people, the vivacious Martha-Louise is not your average funeral director.

Her mother died when Martha-Louise was only eight, exposing her to the emotional journey that comes with death. It is perhaps this innate understanding that attracted her to work as a funeral director in the maledominated industry 25 ears ago.

To most, the role of the funeral director is perceived as a mysterious and dark vocation, best left to those of a sombre demeanour, who tend to talk in hushed tones. The warm and dynamic Martha-Louise is the complete antithesis, flicking a bright light on the darkness that shrouds this industry.

Martha-Louise believes the role of a funeral director is a true privilege, as she explains. "Being part of such an intimate and fragile time in people's lives, is incredibly humbling. For me, it is about connecting with people from such different backgrounds, making them feel at ease and ensuring their wishes are honoured". Perhaps, it is Martha-Louise's own battle with cancer on three separate occasions and subsequent treatments, that makes her so attuned to people's needs enabling her to readily empathise with families.

All too familiar with the strain that accompanies grief, she encourages the increasing trend in preplanning funerals. "Knowing what a person's wishes are before they die, makes the planning and decision process for the family so much easier, especially when it comes to details like the type of funeral, who will lead the service, music, or even the option of having an inividualized casket".

When asked if working with the dead is scary, Martha-Louise flashes her warm smile and says, "it is not the dead people you should be scared of - it is the living you need to watch out for". It is this open and honest approach to death that sets Martha-Louise and Manning Funerals apart.

Health and Safety in a New Zealand not-forprofit organisation



The Local Government elections will be over by the time you read this. In part, they are all about community and the not-for-profit sector

In New Zealand, not-for-profit organisations have a legal and ethical responsibility to

ensure the health and safety of everyone involved in their operations. This includes paid staff, volunteers, contractors, and members of the public. Under the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015, not-for-profits that employ staff are considered Persons Conducting a Business or Undertaking (PCBUs) and must actively manage risks to health and safety.

Key responsibilities include identifying potential hazards, assessing risks, and taking reasonable steps to eliminate or minimise them. For example, organisations running community events, operating op shops, or delivering food parcels must consider physical safety, manual handling, hygiene, and emergency preparedness.

Even if the organisation is entirely volunteer-run, there remains a duty of care. Volunteers must have a safe environment, clear instructions, training, and support. Health and safety policies should be written, communicated, and reviewed regularly. Incident reporting and emergency response plans should be in place and understood by all.



Businesses must now have an effective Health and Safety culture with an ever-increasing personal liability for Business Owners, Managers, and exposure for Company Directors, Trustees, and members of Governing Entities.

Safer Community

As Summer is around the corner, so is the risk of Fire



Hazards close to your home

Start with your home and work your way out:

- 1. Keep grass short, watered and green during the Summer months.
- 2- Keep gutters and areas around decks clear of dead leaves, debris and pine needles.
- 3- Don't store flammable material under or against your house or deck (including flammable doormats).
- 4- Remove highly flammable plants close to your home and other buildings on your property.
- 5- If you have vegetation against your house, consider removing it or replacing plants with less flammable species.
- 6- View: https://www.checkitsalright.nz/reduce-your-risk/low-flammability-plants

Around your property

Your home and everything up to 30 meters surrounding it will determine if a fire can burn your house down.

Unlike floods, hurricanes or earthquakes, there are simple and often inexpensive ways to make your home safer and increase its chances of surviving a fire.



Hazards 10-30 metres from your home:

- Put away outdoor furniture covers when not in use.
- Screen vents and enclose decks so vegetation and debris can't collect, and embers can't enter.
- Use stone, cement, tiles and green grass to create a 'clear zone' around your house so surface fires can't reach your house.
- Prune tree branches to a height of 2 meters or more so

ground fire can't ignite them

- Remove all trees, long grass, shrubs and logs branches, twigs and needles within 10 meters of your house, as they are fuel for fire
- Store firewood 10 meters or more from the house
- Thin trees (with 3-6 meters between crowns) for at least 30 meters from house, this reduces how far and fast a fire can spread

Additional tips

- Ensure your house number is easy for emergency services to find.
- Make sure your driveway is wide enough to accommodate emergency vehicles (at least 4 x 4 meters).
- When building or renovating, consider using fire retardant or non-flammable materials, such as corrugated iron roofs, metal fences and double-glazing.
- If you live closer than 30 meters from your neighbor, it will pay to talk to them. What occurs on their property will impact on yours.

Don't wait until you smell smoke in the air and see flames on the ridgeline to make a plan, because it will be too late. Take steps to understand how fire may affect your property, your home and your buildings. Consider the advice above and develop a plan of action that you can put into effect before an event. activities, making them easier for everyone to get into and enjoy. Al tech isn't brand new; it's been used for a while in our gadgets and online. Al is making life easier in many areas such as web searches, text, writing and research assistance. It can help accessibility for those who are hard of hearing or vision impaired. It may suggest products you might like when shopping, or to detect fraud on your bank account.

However Al can make things up and provide information that sounds accurate or factual but is incorrect. Scammers are now using AI to create very convincing scam stories, create fake videos or convincing-looking photos. Scammers can use AI to write convincing emails or texts that appear to be from a trusted source. Be sceptical and always verify contacts and content carefully via official or trusted channels.

Privacy. Al tools often collect and store your data to improve their functionality. This can compromise your privacy as it could be shared or used without your knowledge. Avoid entering personal or confidential details (like bank information or passwords) into Al tools.

Warning tips. Are you surprised at a message? Is it unexpected, urgent or emotionally changed? Is there controlling behaviour? Are you being pushed to act quickly, click on a link or not consult others? Is access requested? Are they asking for personal details or access to your account or device? Is money requested? Are they asking for payments or gift cards? Stop and seek support. Stop communicating and contact someone you trust, or contact Netsafe on netsafe.org.nz or call 0508 638 723. Netsafe is New Zealand's independent, nonprofit online safety organisation.

Calm Starts with Clear **Boundaries**

Anxiety has quietly become an epidemic not just in people, but in our pets too. Dogs are emotional mirrors: they sense our stress.

inconsistency, and uncertainty. When we're frazzled, so are they.

One of the simplest yet most powerful antidotes is healthy boundaries. A fence doesn't just keep things out; it keeps things safe within. Boundaries provide predictability and security - the same way a child feels calmer with bedtime routines and clear rules.

Inconsistent training confuses animals. Without structure, an anxious dog begins making its own decisions, which can spiral into fear-based aggression. Consistency isn't control – it's compassion through leadership.

A routine - same feeding times, daily walks, known bedtime - tells the nervous system: "You're safe." I often teach new puppy owners the art of gentle containment - hold your pup calmly until it relaxes completely, then release. Make relaxation part of their norm. That moment of surrender builds lifelong trust and is far easier to instil in puppies, compared with adult dogs.

A relaxed, confident dog with clear boundaries is a joy to live with and a positive presence in the community. But a confused, anxious, or fearful dog can become a ticking time bomb. Let's make calm, connected, compassionate dog training normal again - and give our pets the leadership and love they need to thrive.

Trade Me Property listings up 24%

Hopeful vendors surged into the market in September. with the number of new listings on Trade Me Property up a whopping 24% compared to August, and up 5.9% compared to September last year.

Enduring Powers of Attorney

As you age, it can get harder to make important decisions about your welfare and about your property. This can happen because of loss of mental capacity, or even just additional difficulties in navigating banking systems, contracts and the medical system.

An Enduring Power of Attorney (EPA) allows you to appoint someone you trust to act as your attorney in certain circumstances and endures beyond any loss of mental capacity. There are two sorts of EPAs under New Zealand law. One for Health (dealing with matters relating to your general care and welfare) and another for Property (dealing with your property affairs). In each case, it is essential that you give your EPA to a person you trust completely to uphold your financial or health interests.

Your EPA must be given before you have lost capacity to understand and appreciate your own property or health interests. It is possible for someone to instead apply to the court to be appointed as your property manager or welfare guardian if you lose capacity without granting an EPA. A property manager or welfare guardian can make many of the same decisions as an EPA. However, that process can take very long and involves significant costs. The court order will also need to be extended every 3 years.

Improving elements of your property so you can charge more for rent makes economic sense if the long-term gains will easily offset the improvement costs. Understanding all obligations mortgages by Tina White



The word mortgage comes from 'death pledge'. It's not as gloomy as it sounds, but it does hint at the seriousness of what you're signing up for. When you borrow money from a bank to purchase your home. the bank will usually register what's called an all obligations mortgage on your property title as security for the loan.

One of the most common forms of mortgage security; it doesn't just cover the loan you're currently taking out; it secures all current and future debts with that same bank. This includes your new home loan, any personal loans, credit cards, loans you've guaranteed for someone else, joint accounts with others and company loans where you're a director.

We recently acted for a de facto couple purchasing a home together. Their bank required an all obligations mortgage. During our meeting, we explained the implications of this type of mortgage. One client mentioned he already owned another property with his siblings, and it too was mortgaged with the same bank. Because both properties were secured by all obligations mortgages with that same bank, the bank could treat them as connected security. This meant that if the siblings defaulted on their loan, the bank could choose to sell either property to recover its costs-including the de facto couple's new home-even if their loan was in good standing.

To reduce your exposure under an all obligations mortgage, you could consider using different banks for different loans or financial relationships (e.g. business vs personal) or ask your bank for assurance that they would treat each property in isolation.



Mortgagee Sales Double

A sharp increase in the number of mortgagee sale properties has emerged over the last few weeks.

Interest.co.nz has been tracking the number of mortgagee sales on the market each week since November 2022. Mortgagee sales have hovered between 50 and 60 for most of last year, then began rising again this year. The increase in mortgagee sales has been particularly strong since late September this year. At the beginning of October it went past 90 for the first time since interest.co.nz began collating the numbers. By mid-October, the numbers had surged to 109.

The timing of the increase is surprising because it comes as mortgage interest rates have been falling. However, Reserve Bank data shows the total value of impaired loans held by banks increased by \$15 million in August to \$563 million.

However, the fact the number of mortgagee sales has been rising even as interest rates fall suggests the most likely reason is borrowers have faced an unexpected drop in income, usually due to job loss or business failure.

In such situations, no amount of mortgage restructure can make up for the fact the borrower simply has no money coming in. The borrowers who will be most vulnerable in such a situation will be those who bought during the 2021/22 housing boom, particularly those who purchased their property with a low equity loan at the maximum term available, and then suffered a loss of income.

As well as losing their ability to make their mortgage payments, these people may also have faced the indignity of being tipped into negative equity, as the value of their home declined in the face of a weaker housing market, leaving them with little wriggle room to restructure the loan.

The Joy and Power of reading with young people: A playful path to vocabulary and understanding


Reading with young people is a little bit like planting a magical seed-you never quite know how it will grow, but with care, imagination, and a few good storybooks, something wonderful always happens. 



For Eyes Optometrists are sharing a range of case histories detected with their specialised examination equipment.

Today's patient had no symptoms, but his Optomap wide-field scans showed a subtle dark patch just under the

left optic nerve (marked with an arrow in the image 1). The blood vessels crossing the area suggest it is raised, so optical coherence tomography (OCT) scans were performed to provide a cross-section view of the retina and confirm this. A raised lump can be clearly seen in image 2.

This patient had seen an eve specialist 5 years prior and there was no record of a lump, suggesting it could be of recent onset (although being subtle, it may simply not have been observed on that occasion). Optometrist Molly Whittington sent a report to the original eye specialist who referred the case on to an oncology ophthalmologist at Greenlane Hospital for specialised tests, as a dark, raised lump of recent onset is suspicious for an early melanoma.

The diagnosis was good news: a choroidal hemangioma. These are not cancers and never metastasise. Typically. they are reddish to orange coloured but can have areas of increased pigmentation like this one, which can make them difficult to differentiate from choroidal melanomas.

Hemangiomas can grow within the blood vessel layer beneath the retina called the choroid. If located in the macula (centre of vision) or if they leak fluid which causes a retinal detachment or cystic changes in the retina, they can affect visual acuity. However, many choroidal hemangiomas never grow or leak fluid and can be observed without treatment. This one will be monitored annually, with referral made if any changes occur.

Is Botox® reversible? Anon. Kumeu

No. It is understandable to want reassurance that if you try a treatment and don't love the result, there's a way back, but Botox® isn't reversible the same way dermal fillers

Most fillers are made of

hyaluronic acid, and if needed, can be dissolved instantly with a special enzyme called Hyaluronidase. Botox® is different. Once it's placed into a muscle, it binds to the nerve endings and blocks their signals. This relaxation is what softens expression lines and prevents new wrinkles from forming. There is no medication that can "erase" Botox® once it's there.

That doesn't mean you're stuck if you don't like the look. The effect is temporary. Your body naturally breaks down the toxin over time, and the nerve endings regenerate, returning to full function once it wears off gradually over three to four months. In some cases, if there is any imbalance, a small adjustment can be made with additional units to restore symmetry.

If you're nervous about trying Botox®, the best approach is to start with a light dose and build up gradually. That way you can ease into the treatment and feel confident about how your face responds.

The key takeaway? Botox® isn't reversible in the moment, but it's never permanent. With careful, conservative treatment, the results should feel natural and reassuring.



And if you decide it isn't for you, your face will always return to its normal movement as the effects wear off.

Let's not put all the hard work at risk next year

Last month the Reserve Bank reduced the Official Cash Rate (OCR) by 50 basis points to 2.5% - the eighth OCR reduction since August last year.

This could mean a saving of more than \$400 a fortnight compared to the middle of last year for a family making minimum repayments with a 25-year, \$500,000 mortgage.

We celebrate OCR reductions for those with mortgages, because they do flow through to falling interest rates – which are good news for growth, jobs and investment. It also means more discretionary income in the hands of many local families.

The Government is doing its bit. We've stopped wasteful spending and inflation is under control – now at 2.7% down from 7.3% under Labour.

We are singularly focused on growing our economy by backing our farmers and growers, promoting tourism, investing in infrastructure, and chasing trade deals and making New Zealand a great place to do business.

The next OCR announcement – and the last one for 2025 – is on 26 November.

It has been a tough six years for Kiwis, with Covid-19, a cost-of-living crisis, and a big economic hangover. Sadly, we're not out of the woods yet, but we can now at least see some light.

The forecasts point to growth strengthening next year, which will help wages, job opportunities, and we'll start to see house prices rebounding too.

I personally believe that when things start to improve, Kiwis will positively respond and really rally to the more exciting times ahead. Afterall, it has been a hard-fought grind by everyone to get the country back on track.

I also believe that despite the tight political polls, Kiwis won't want to risk such progress at next year's election.



Patrols will also conduct reassurance visits and patrols of areas which may have been affected by recent crime.

The nine patrols are all self-funded which includes supplying their patrol vehicles, registration, insurance and fuel. Patroller uniforms, training and specialty equipment. Many are very grateful to receive grants from their Auckland Council Local Boards and in some cases generous sponsorship from local west Auckland businesses such as Mitre10 Mega Westgate. Thanks to the West City Auto Group, vehicle servicing costs are covered by them for all nine patrols irrespective of the vehicle brand or purchase history.

A combination of Waitematā West Community Patrols are part of the newly formed "West Auckland Safety Network" along with the NZ Police, Auckland Transport, Pacific Wardens and Auckland Councils Compliance Wardens. Collectively the Network works in unison to make the Henderson and New Lynn shopping districts and surrounds a safer place to shop, work and visit.

"It's not rocket science" says John Cowsill - District Support Officer for CPNZ. "The more volunteer patrollers each patrol can recruit, the more patrols we will have out and about in the community".

If you are 18 years or older and can clear a Police vetting check, we would love to hear from you. The nine patrol bases are South Kaipara, Nor-West, West Harbour, Ranui-Swanson, Henderson, Waiatarua, Glen Eden, Te Atatu-Glendene and New Lynn-Kelston.

Only 40% of Hospice funding comes from Te Whatu Ora (Health N.Z.). Hospice currently has 261 people on their books and provides a service to over 800 people a year. The balance of their funding comes from donations, bequests and the Hospice shops.

In October we advocated for Blue September for men's prostate cancer awareness with the Prostate Foundation. Problems with parking



Parking infringement notices are irritating. They seem to pop up when you're already stressed by some other thing. But I can confirm, with absolute belief, that the council parking officer does not hide out in your vicinity

waiting for time to run away on your meter ... it just seems that way, sometimes.

The rules for parking on public land are mostly made at a national level and can be found in the Road Code. Some specific parking rules may also be made at a local level by Auckland Council. For example, a local authority can restrict parking in certain areas as long as they display appropriate signs.

If you think you have been ticketed incorrectly by Auckland Transport you can dispute your ticket.

You can only submit a dispute if you are:

- the person named on the ticket

- the person registered for the vehicle.

You cannot submit a dispute for someone else, such as your partner or child.

If the ticket was not issued to you but you are responsible for the offence, you can request a transfer of liability to

The vast majority of disputes that are sent to Auckland Transport (AT) are not successful because they do not have a valid legal basis. This includes most special vehicle lane infringements and parking infringements.

If you park in a private car park, then any information displayed about parking there forms a contract between you and the owner/operator. By parking in the car park, you are agreeing to the terms of the contract.

Auckland's De-sexing Clinic



Auckland Council's first in-house desexing clinic making strides in dog desexing programme.

Auckland Council's first-ever in-house dog desexing clinic is starting to show real impact in the city's battle against dog

overpopulation, with 475 desexing procedures already completed in just under five months.

The clinic, led by veterinarian Dr Roz Holland, has so far desexed 229 male dogs and 246 female dogs free of charge, with a waitlist of around 140 more dogs currently being assessed. The team is also preparing more targeted desexing campaigns in high-need areas, and numbers are expected to climb as processes become more streamlined. This is one of Auckland Council's many steps it is taking to tackle the roaming dog issues and to help keep Aucklanders safe from attacks from unwanted dogs. The programme is funded through infringement fees collected from owners of unregistered dogs, ensuring the cost burden does not fall on responsible

Dr Holland, who joined council's Animal Management team earlier this year, says the results so far show the programme is hitting the mark.

"Everyone involved in dog control and dog welfare knows the key issue is overpopulation, and desexing is vitally important to addressing that issue. Unfortunately, the barriers, cost and transport, are just too high for many people. This role appealed to me because it directly addresses those challenges and has the resources to make a real impact," she says.

The scale of the problem in Auckland is clear. The council receives more than 15,000 reports of roaming dogs every year, with incidents rising by 50 per cent since 2020. More than 1,300 dog attacks on people are recorded annually, with a similar number of attacks on other animals.

This campaign highlights the benefits of desexing and containing dogs, connecting with owners on a personal level. It is focused particularly on south and west Auckland, where roaming and dog attacks are most prevalent.

Mobile extortion scams



As Al makes fake voices and videos sound and look real, high-pressure plays like sextortion (threatening to leak nude photos or videos, or expose pornographic search history), deepfakes, and virtual kidnapping feel more believable than ever before, tricking even the most digitally savvy

users. Scammers sound convincing, talking as though they know you, trying to help you in some way to fix something, but are just fishing for more information. Young men are particularly at risk, but these threatening tactics target anyone with a smartphone. The attitude "I'm more likely to click a link on my phone than on my laptop" can play a big role in overall risk. Almost all of the victims of this type of extortion experience emotional harm after falling for a scam. Many of us use our phones to shop, find deals, and pay-and we deserve to be able to do that safely.

Many victims are overconfident and under protected, by failing to use appropriate security measures, such as security software, checking app permissions, using strong passwords, regular data backups and software updates. Stay alert by using appropriate strategies. Don't let urgency or pressure push you into action. Take a breath before responding. Legitimate businesses like your bank or credit card don't push you to immediate action. If you answered the phone and are feeling panicked about the situation, perhaps involving a family member or friend, ask

a question only the real person would know-something that can't be found online. If it feels off, hang up or end the conversation. You can always say the connection dropped. Confirm the person is who they say they are by reaching out yourself through a trusted number, website, or method you've used before.

The criminals behind extortion scams pour time and money into targeting their victims, constantly evolving their tactics to make the scams more believable and hard-hitting. For more detail, visit malwarebytes.com







Local elections
