Just keep reading and take care this August.








Te Kori Scott Point

Progress is continuing at Te Kori Scott Point (formerly the Sustainable Sports Park) with tinges of green appearing across the site. After a year of earthworks, drainage and topsoiling, informal recreation areas have been sown with grass. The first two sports fields will be sown in the spring. Concreting of paths



and cycleways has started. A wetland area has been shaped around a natural aquifer and is being planted. The first baseball diamond is under construction.

Joshua Carder Drive and Craig's Way road extensions are being sealed, and a roundabout to link them has started. A new toilet and changing room facility has been installed. This was made offsite and craned into place. The cladding is made from a plastic wood composite using fully recycled materials, which is resistant to warping and requires no painting. Work continues with laying the artificial playing surface of the baseball diamond, sealing of the car park off Squadron Drive and construction of boardwalks.



But all they are coming up with are ideas that are either *already the law* or will do NOTHING to reduce offending or reoffending.

And another one from ACT. Proposing to move 17 year old offenders from the Youth Court into the District Court (DC). It already IS the law for 17 year olds who commit serious offending (including aggravated robbery and serious violence) to be dealt with in the DC. ACT is therefore proposing to send low-level offending (such as minor traffic, driving or property offences) into an already stretched DC system. To achieve what exactly? Judges sentencing first time 17 year old offenders have a raft of sentencing options available including discharge without conviction, conviction without sentence, or low level community work hours.

The Youth Court process involves family group conferences to establish a plan for the young person that addresses the underlying drivers of their offending, which is then under the direct oversight of a judge. If that young person does not follow the plan, the Court will then give them a more serious sentence. Reducing re-offending is the primary goal of the Youth Court. Sending more youth offenders to adult court will miss the opportunity to help those young people turn their lives around.

The only way to truly get tough on crime is to address the underlying factors. Without that, all we have are meaningless slogans by politicians to win votes.

Manning Funerals

Some people may recognize me from my daily circuit around Hobsonville Point each morning with my band of canines, while others may know me as the business owner of Manning Funeral Cottage, but today, I want to talk about my other passion - elephants!

Prior to Covid, I travelled twice yearly to Thailand to volunteer at Elephant Nature Park in Chiang Mai, the home to over 120 rescued elephants who can finally put behind them the decades of abuse of working at riding camps, or in shows, all for the degrading entertainment of



humans. Not only does Lek open her sanctuary to elephants, but she also provides a home for some 3000 other animals; dogs, cats, pigs, rabbits, water buffalo, horses, to name but a few.

Saengduean "Lek" Chailert, the founder of Save Elephant Foundation has been a life-long activist for the Asian elephant and has received many global awards over the past two decades; including being named one of Time's Women of the Century, receiving a prestigious award in Thailand from President Macron of France, or being welcomed to the White House by then Secretary of State, Hillary Clinton. It is exciting that Lek will be visiting New Zealand for only two screenings of her new documentary "Elephant Mother"; one will be in Auckland and the other in Christchurch. The documentary covers the plight of the Asian elephant during Covid, and the crucial role Lek has played in alleviating their suffering. Following the screening, she will hold a Q&A. There will be light refreshments, a bar and raffles. This will be a rare opportunity to hear this inspirational woman.

When tech meets sustainable design

The RE:MAKER SPACE in Westgate, Massey has just purchased a refurbished laser cutter for community design courses. A laser cutter has a focused and high-energy laser beam which is pointed at various materials (thin wood, fabric, foam, plastic and cardboard), strong enough to melt and evaporate the material upon impact, until the material is separated, and the cut is made. The resulting materials' vapour is blown out with special gases and high pressure. The machine can also engrave any design onto the product or design.



There will be four programmes available to the community in Term 3. The ReCreators are excited to be able to combine design and tech for upcycling purposes. Laser cutters are the perfect machines to take old materials and then turn them into professional designs and products.

The courses in July and August will run over four weeks and are available for people 14+ - so suitable for teens and adults. At the end of the course participants should be able to; Confidently design using Inkscape or other apps, Know how to cut 0.1-5mm cardboard, cardstock/paper, fabric, 0.8-5mm wood on a laser cutter, Understand all health and safety around using a laser cutter and Understand what materials can be used and how to upcycle using a laser cutter.

Health and Safety is a huge part of the course as you can blind or gas yourself with this machinery. But once you understand how to manage and mitigate all the risks, participants will then learn how to draw on Inkscape which can be used for endless designs. The course aims for people to master 3 material types and understand settings for the machine to cut or engrave. Selecting the best cutting process depends on the specific application, the product/ design needs and other critical factors.

Once you have laser skills, you can make almost anything - jewellery, boxes, 3D animals (put together with multiple 2 dimensional shapes) - the possibilities are endless. And you can get many materials for free by understanding how upcycling works.



Every few days, I Zoom chat with past or present migrant/expat distance grandchild somewhere in the world. My question is always, "How is it (or how was it) being a




They tell incredibly varied stories. Unexpected, pop up thoughts surprise them. Childhood experiences are being connected to their adult viewpoint. Themes of legacy and respect surface. They talk about global family life and the impact of being distance grandchildren.

After we talk, I transcribe our conversations. You'd think you'd remember conversations until you transcribe them and see how

So what happens then? The stories constantly swirl in my head, taking on a deeper meaning. I compare findings. I re-read our conversations. Each reflection is like a jigsaw piece finding its rightful place. Sometimes reflections even appear in my dreams and my brain gives them a sub-title and a tentative chapter 'home'.

All my interviewees enjoy the experience. It is an honour to be the temporary custodian of their reflections and stories.



look out for blue or grey 'ticks' on the page which are given to pages or profiles verified by Facebook. There are risks when trading on all online platforms. Facebook buy and sell pages and groups are not moderated by Facebook. The safest option is to only pay the seller after you have inspected the goods in person. However, if this isn't possible it's important to remember that if the deal looks too good to be true, it probably is. Unfortunately, it can be difficult to get money back that has been lost in one of these scams. The usual way to deal with this kind of dispute in NZ is to go to the Disputes Tribunal. Please note that you will need to have an address for the seller and there is a fee to apply. For full details, search "Facebook Trading Scams at netsafe.org.nz.

Extract from Worksafe news story

Experience no substitute for risk management - The death of a West Coast flooring company employee has drawn a strong warning from WorkSafe New Zealand to businesses not to rely on the experience of workers in the absence of proper risk identification and management. In March 2019 an employee of Coastwide Flooring Limited was installing carpet in a Greymouth building using a strong organic solvent-based adhesive. The worker had 17 years' experience in the industry. He was found unresponsive by a coworker and died three days later in Christchurch Hospital's intensive care unit.

WorkSafe's Investigations Manager for the South Island, Steve Kelly, said the company had a lax approach to health and safety. "The particular adhesive the worker was using was known to be a health hazard, but the company had not undertaken a risk assessment on its use; it had no safe system of work for working with the adhesive particularly in relation to ventilation and the use of fans; and nor did it provide effective information, training and instruction for workers," he said. "The company largely relied on the experience of its workers to protect themselves from the effects of the adhesive, and that approach was simply unacceptable. "Since this tragic incident, Coastwide Flooring has implemented a suite of improvements to its operations, but for this worker, that is too little too late," Mr Kelly said. Today the business appeared in court for failing to ensure the health and safety of its workers and was fined \$60,000 and ordered to pay reparations of \$105,000 to the victim's family.

Coastwide Flooring Limited was sentenced at the Greymouth District Court on Thursday 29 April. A fine of \$ 60,000 was imposed. Reparation of \$105,000 was ordered to be paid to the victim's family. Coastwide Flooring Limited was sentenced under sections 36(1)(a), 48(1) and 48(2)(c) of the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015. Being a PCBU having a duty to ensure so far as is reasonably practicable,

the health and safety of workers who work for the PCBU, while the workers are at work in the 29 April 20212 business or undertaking, namely while installing flooring, did fail to comply with that duty, and that failure exposed the workers to a risk of death, or serious injury. Carries a maximum penalty of \$1,500,000.

Healthy families

For people everywhere, food is the great connector. Being able to share food in a culturally appropriate way plays a significant role in our physical, social, and emotional understanding of the world around us. As access to nourishing, affordable kai becomes further and further out of reach for many people in Aotearoa, people are looking back at past practices to inform a new pathway into the future. The Mana Motuhake o te Kai - food secure communities' framework - was created by the West Auckland Kāhui Māori Collective for people who want to learn how mātauranga Māori principles can inform growing, sharing and preparing kai.

The framework is bringing a fresh perspective to projects that are led by the Healthy Active Learning (HAL) team at Sport Waitākere. Improving the wellbeing of tamariki and rangatahi through kai and nutrition is a key focus for the HAL team, who work predominantly with schools.

"The HAL team has strong connections to schools and extensive knowledge of school curriculum. I've been helping to familiarise them with the framework, and together, we've identified several areas where schools might be able to use it alongside their learning plans", explains Giuliana Sewell, Systems Innovator for Healthy Families Waitākere.

Several schools in the Massey area have expressed their eagerness to include more agricultural education in their curriculum.

"We presented the Mana Motuhake o te Kai framework to the teacher leads from three schools in Massey and they gave us some great feedback. The next step for us will be one on one sessions with the schools to map out how they can use the framework as a guide for their kai initiatives", says Sewell.

Mana motuhake o te kai was designed from an ao Māori point of view but also supports the inclusion of ideas and practices for all people.

Property market report

Housing sales are lumpy, prices up slightly, fewer listings and buyers hesitant.

Latest data from the Real Estate Institute of New Zealand (REINZ) delivers very mixed messages, with sales volumes inconclusive but prices firm.

The REINZ recorded 5629 residential property sales nationally in June, down 4.1% compared to May, suggesting market activity remains at a low ebb.

The national median selling price was \$780,000 in June, unchanged from May, but down 8.2% compared to June last year.

However the REINZ House Price Index (HPI), which adjusts for differences in the mix of properties sold each month, was up 0.4% nationally in June compared to May.

There was less stock on the market, with a total of 24,676 residential properties available for sale at the end of June. That's down 7.5% compared to May, and down 6.1% compared to June last year.

New listings were also down, with 6218 received in June. That's down 15.5% compared to May, and down 21.2% compared to June last year, suggesting vendors remain hesitant about selling.

Salespeople continue to report increased first home buyer activity with the easing of LVR [loan-to-value ratio] restrictions that came into effect on June 1.

Although activity has increased, caution remains as interest rates, an election and further financial strain caused by the cost of living tempers investment.

In the three months ending June 2023, 15,934 sales have occurred, a 1.2% increase year-on-year.

A lack of listings and the challenge of navigating the current economic climate are putting.

The Median price point in Auckland is static showing down 22% from peak, but still almost 3% up on 2018 prices.

Sorting out your relationship property

The Property (Relationships) Act 1976 ("PRA") applies to couples who are married, in a civil union partnership, a de facto relationship, as well as same-sex couples. The PRA presumes an equal contribution by each partner and aims to achieve a just division of relationship property when the relationship ends. A partner's contribution is not limited to financial contributions but also other things such as looking after the children, the household or property belonging to

the couple.

Couples may prefer that the PRA does not apply to all or some of their relationship property. This could either be in anticipation of or during a relationship, or at the end of a relationship. A contracting-out agreement would then be necessary to achieve this. The PRA sets out certain formalities which are required for a valid contracting-out agreement. These requirements include that:

- each party must have independent legal advice before signing the agreement;
- the signature of each party must be witnessed by a lawyer;
- the lawyer witnessing the signature must certify that he or she explained the effect and implication of the agreement to that party.

It is important that these requirements are met to have a valid agreement. Otherwise, you may have to approach a court to validate the agreement (which can be expensive). It can also result in assets being exposed to creditors which you may have thought were taken out of their reach.



They all have varying policies, pricing and services. Things like selfemployed income, overseas or rental income and multi ownership structures may be treated differently, affecting the amount you can borrow.

Additionally, banks have tools to gauge the suitability of an applicant such as stress test rates and UMI (uncommitted monthly income) calculations which differ across all the lenders. The UMI is a calculation that the bank does to assess how much uncommitted income you will have left over at the end of the month - No two banks have the same calculation, a Mortgage Adviser can quickly test this before submitting your application.

With the recent relaxation of the Loan-to-Value ratio restrictions, banks are now able to open up the doors to more low deposit borrowers. It can be quite tricky trying to navigate the options as there are so many available, so my job is to make sure that I find every dollar possible for my clients in this ever changing market.

What happens when a buyer can't settle?

You've secured an unconditional sale on your property, booked the moving truck, and got your ducks all lined up, in contemplation of a smooth move on settlement day. But what happens if the Purchaser throws a spanner in the works and defaults? Although the vast majority of transactions we see go without a hiccough, there is always a risk of a buyer not completing the purchase. So what options are available to you, should you end up in this position?



An Agreement for Sale and Purchase is used to buy and sell property and is a legally

binding contract committing the buyer to completing the purchase on the agreed settlement day. The Agreement includes a clause which outlines what happens when the buyer does not complete (in lawyer-speak, this is called defaulting). Should this occur, the seller is entitled to charge a daily penalty until the buyer completes the purchase. This penalty interest rate is calculated on the unpaid purchase price at the interest rate on the front of the Agreement (usually 12% - 16% pa).

If the Purchaser does not settle, then we can issue a settlement notice. This means the Purchaser will have 12 working days to settle. After that, you have the option to cancel the Agreement and keep the buyer's deposit (up to 10% of the purchase price). This is why a



larger deposit is ideal from the seller's perspective, as the deposit can cover any real estate agent commission that is due and then the balance is yours. You don't have to cancel the Agreement, you could go back to market and see if the first Purchaser can settle before you sell to someone else. You are then in a position to sell your property to an alternative Purchaser. You can also claim any loss on the subsequent sale from the original Purchaser - for example if the property sells for less.

There is also another remedy - suing for specific performance. This means going to Court, seeking an order for the Purchaser to complete the settlement. We find most often that the reason Purchasers don't settle is due to lack of funds, so going to Court may not be the best option and will involve significant time and money.

It is highly stressful when a buyer defaults, but you can rely on us to advocate on your behalf to achieve a successful outcome for you. The what, why and how of mediation

What is a mediation actually like? What can you do to best prepare for it? Where do things go wrong? And when you are both so far apart, is it worth even bothering?

We talked to high profile mediator Tony Lendrum in episode 4 of the Divorce Café podcast, to find out how he goes about mediating a dispute, why he thinks it's worth doing, and what are its the limits or risks.

What is mediation? Mediation is a dispute resolution process that provides an alternative to going to Court, whereby parties engage in a structured and semi-formal discussion with an independent mediator who assists them to resolve their dispute.

If parties can reach an agreed settlement of their dispute, at the end of the mediation an agreement is prepared documenting its terms, and is signed by the parties and the lawyers.

Why mediate? There's a lot to like about mediation:

- it is one of the most efficient forms of dispute resolution, and can enable parties to avoid the stress and expense associated with court proceedings.
- it is a confidential process, which enables parties to deal with important and sensitive issues privately.
- there is no obligation to settle it is a voluntary process meaning that the parties decide whether any of the proposed solutions meet

their needs.

Mediation lacks many of the adversarial parts of litigation - for example you will have an opportunity to speak if you would like to, and you will not be cross examined. Because it is voluntary and aims to reach a consensus, mediation can also improve relationships in a way that litigation rarely can.

An effective mediator can also bring the interests of children into the mediation, including in certain instances hearing from the children in advance. Tony Lendrum says that he will sometimes use the following approach:

"[I] ask the parents to imagine that their children are, for the day's purposes, all between 14-16 years old and that they will be listening closely to what their parents say to each other, and more importantly, how they say it over the course of the day."

Tony's top tip for people preparing to go to mediation is not to "anchor" to a particular position, but to be open-minded to a range of outcomes. Crucially, parties should consult their legal representative and ensure they have all the information they need to make in informed choice to settle, or not.

It's a legally binding settlement - Among the many benefits of a mediation for resolving a dispute, are risks that arise from the fact that people are different, in their priorities and the power they wield in the relationship. These are factors discussed in the Court of Appeal's decision in what Tony Lendrum considers a pivotal case: Hildred v Strong. Mediations need to be handled by experienced mediators and lawyers because despite those power imbalances, Hildred confirms that in the absence of some fairly extreme bad conduct, the parties will be considered to be "able, adult parties who are separately represented" and the agreement will stand.

Hildred v Strong showed that that agreement is a contract that is effective to alter what would otherwise be the legal rights of the parties – even if: the parties later change their minds, the agreement isn't what a Court might have given them, or they later consider they didn't have all the information they needed from the other to properly agree anything.

Either party may walk out of a mediation without an agreement if the process isn't serving them. That's important because if a party does stay, they will be considered to have stayed and settled for their own rational reasons.





With the club still in recess for the winter, I thought I would share a recipe. Our rhubarb is growing well and I recently made Rhubarb & Ginger Muffins.

Ingredients are 100 g melted butter 1/2 cup sugar 2 eggs 1/2 tsp baking soda 1/2 cup warm milk 1 tsp vanilla essence 2 cups finely chopped rhubarb 2 tbsp finely chopped glace ginger 2 cups selfraising flour 2 tsp ground ginger. Preheat oven to 200 degrees C, grease 12 muffin pans. Beat together butter, sugar & eggs, dissolve soda in milk and add to batter, along with essence, rhubarb & ginger. Fold in flour & ground ginger until just combined. Divide mix into pans. Bake 15 minutes until risen and lightly golden and bounces back to the touch. Best eaten on the day but can be frozen. Variations include swapping rhubarb for feijoa, pear or apple. Or

to be gained from spending time in the garden, especially the Kumeu Community Garden.

There are two chemical triggers released in the human body when we apply ourselves to gardening:

Dealing with a soggy lawn

Last year I talked about it being wetter than I had experienced while mowing (since 2005), but this year has seen even more rain. Rainfall records, and it's been continuous. Although just recently we have had some breaks and the soil is recovering, many lawns were saturated beyond the bond strength of the soil -the soil no longer

has structure and ends up with the consistency of porridge. The lawn can't even be walked on let alone mown.

It's not the just the amount of rain – if it all fell in one day it would flow and drain away, and the lawns would quickly dry out – but it's the way it has fallen. Lots of rain day after day, which means the lawns don't get a chance to drain and after about three days of saturation they lose strength and turn to 'porridge'. Some lawns are so soft I'm thinking of buying a hover mower and a set of snowshoes to strap onto my mowing boots.

So how can you help your lawn cope better with next winter?

- 1 Keep your car off the grass. Even when conditions are ok, a car compacts the soil, squeezing out the airspaces and sealing it up, this affects the lawn in winter by preventing the water draining. In winter when the lawn is soft any cars on lawns will make a huge mess.
- 2 Stop cutting the grass so low. We seem to have a tradition in NZ of wanting really, really short lawns, and it's not good for the lawn. There is roughly the same amount of plant material above and below ground, so long lush grass will have long, large roots below the ground. This helps keep the soil together when it is soft, more importantly it aids good soil structure and air spaces and gives a pathway for drainage. And in summer the lawn will tolerate drought better as the roots go deeper to find the moisture lower down.
- 3 Aerate the soil if a small lawn maybe use a screwdriver or garden fork, stab it in and lever back & forth to make air holes, or for a larger lawn hire an aerating machine. This gets air, water and nutrients further into the soil and the soil can breathe and drain. It results in healthier grass and a better draining soil.
- 4 if its heavy clay, you may want to add sand and compost as this

breaks up the clay, it also helps microbes and earthworms to do their thing and get that soil structure back.

Further possible steps beyond this can get a bit expensive like adding drains, or redoing the slope or creating gentle swales to redirect the water and stop it pooling over your lawn where the soil stays wet for long periods. As I said above, it's the multiple days of saturation that cause the sogginess, if you can get the water away reasonably quickly you can reduce the chance of the soil turning to much



Why does my dog put its paw on my arm?

As a dog owner, when your furry companion puts their paw on your arm, it's likely their way of communicating and expressing their emotions. Dogs have a rich repertoire of body language, and this behaviour can convey a variety of meanings:

1. Seeking Attention - Dogs often use their paws to get your attention, especially if they want to be petted, played with, or simply acknowledged.



It can be a gentle and non-verbal request for you to engage with them.

- 2. Affection and Bonding Dogs are social animals, and they form strong emotional attachments to their human caregivers. Touch is an essential way for dogs to show affection towards their owners. By placing their paw on your arm, they are trying to connect with you and express their love.
- 3. Comfort-Seeking Dogs may put their paw on your arm when they are feeling anxious or seeking reassurance. The touch provides them with a sense of security and comfort.
- 4. Requesting Something Dogs are clever communicators and can use their paws to ask for something they want, such as food, water, or to go outside for a walk.

West Auckland winery listed as a Category 1 historic place

The heritage values of a West Auckland winery whose buildings and associated landscape demonstrate the cultural diversity of our collective heritage and the development of viticulture in New Zealand have been recognised by the country's lead heritage agency.



Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga has listed the former Corban's Winery and Mt Lebanon Vineyards near Henderson as a Category 1 historic place, identifying the complex as having outstanding national importance.

"The winery and vineyards were founded by pioneer Lebanese winemaker Assid Abraham Corban and his family in 1902 and for seven decades formed the centre of the Corban family's wine production," says Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga's Senior Heritage Assessment Advisor, Martin Jones.

Corban Estate Arts Centre invites visitors to celebrate the Homestead's 100th Anniversary at our Auckland Heritage Festival event 'A House of Love' on Sat 23 September.

This event includes a heritage tour of Corban Estate and many of the fascinating findings from the detailed Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga heritage listing report. 

Base Ingredients: 150g butter, 2 tablespoons golden syrup, ½ cup sugar, ¾ cup desiccated coconut, 1½ cups rolled oats, ¾ cup flour, 1½ teaspoons baking powder, 2 tablespoons ground lemon verbena, ½ cup currants, grated zest of 1 lemon.

Icing Ingredients: 4 tablespoons butter, 8 tablespoons icing sugar, 4 teaspoons golden syrup, 2 teaspoons ground lemon verbena, plus desiccated coconut to sprinkle over.

Method: Preheat the oven to 180C. Line a rectangular sponge roll tin with baking paper. Melt the butter with the golden syrup in a small saucepan. Mix all of the remaining base ingredients together in a large bowl, then pour the melted butter mixture over the dry ingredients and mix well. Press into the tin and bake for 15-20 minutes or until golden in colour.

To make the icing, melt the butter and golden syrup together in a small saucepan. Remove from the heat and add the icing sugar and lemon verbena and mix well. It may take a minute or two of mixing to incorporate the butter into the mixture. Pour over the base and spread evenly with a spatula. Sprinkle over the coconut. Allow to cool completely before cutting. Store in an airtight container for up to 5 days.







Hormone replacement therapy

I'm nearly 60 years old. So the subject of topping up your hormones is dear to my heart (literally because good hormones are good for heart health).

Women's Hormone Top-up Therapy (HTT) has really come out from behind the curtains in the last few years. While previously it was thought that the risks (such as cancer) far outweigh the benefits, nowadays most doctors would say the opposite. Plus, there are strategies to reduce the risk of hormone-dependent cancers including taking aromatase inhibitors like DIM which comes from broccoli.

The risks are lowest if body-identical hormones are used. In the past, we had to get these specially made and they were expensive. Nowadays, estrogen patches and Utrogestan (progesterone) capsules that are available at pharmacies are body-identical, and they are fully funded.

The benefits of topping up your hormones through the menopause include reduced menopausal symptoms like hot flushes, but also higher bone density, better heart health, clearer thinking and mood, and improved libido.

I have had some women who have asked me if progesterone causes weight gain. The answer seems to be no. A systematic literature review has shown estrogens combined with micronised progesterone (which is the most common form of HTT for women in NZ) either has no effect on weight or causes a slight reduction in

What about the Blokes? Men's HTT is a little less common. However, there is a condition called "Grumpy Old Man Syndrome" that is related to declining hormone levels in men. The low hormone levels can cause men to become grumpy, impotent, and to sweat a lot (not the kind of thing I aspire too!). Testosterone supplementation is either via oral capsules, creams to apply to the skin, or more commonly IM injections every 1 to 3 months.

Like women, men should take an aromatase inhibitor to stop their body turning testosterone into estrogen.



First of its kind new development underway at Westagte

A two-level building which faces the Costco service station at ground level and the newly opened Bargain Chemist at the upper level is rapidly taking shape at Westgate.

Next door, ground works have commenced on a building which will be the home to the long-awaited specialist International food store.

These building's are the first of several large-scale projects underway in the immediate vicinity, more on those in later editions.

The first of its kind Quick Service Restaurant development will co-locate with the Costco service station, famous for the best priced fuel in Auckland.

The complex will feature a line-up of well-known food brands, each with a dine-in restaurant and drive-through, all under one

"This is an innovative concept that will provide a range of convenient food options in one place, and will strengthen the surrounding business' and their offerings" says NZRPG

General Manager Campbell Barbour.

Although exact names cannot yet be confirmed there will be one new food offering that is not yet present in the Northwest region.

"I think it's going to be a very busy spot, and will build on the massive impact that Costco has brought to Westgate." says Campbell.

These exciting additions to Westgate will be open for business by early 2024 with more announcements to be made in the lead-up to

All aboard the Western Express

A new and improved bus network is coming to Westgate and Northwest Auckland.

From November 12, Auckland Transport (AT) will launch a new flagship bus route, the Western Express (WX1), along with a range of other improvements to bus routes in the area.

The bus route changes are partnered with more than 7km of new bus lanes, new bus interchanges near the motorway at Lincoln Road and Te Atatu and at least 40 new bus stops.

Waitakere Councillor Shane Henderson says the changes will more than double the number of people in the Northwest who have access to fast and frequent public transport.

"The Northwest is growing," he explains.

"By 2046, there will be 37,000 new houses, 11,000 new jobs, and nearly triple the number of people travelling along the Northwestern Motorway (SH16).

"Currently people living in the Northwest have limited public transport options and when you combine this with the amount of growth, we are seeing huge pressure on the roading network," says Shane.

"These changes can't come soon enough." AT's Executive General Manager of Public Transport, Stacey van der Putten says the changes are about making public transport an easier, quicker, and more reliable option.

"The new WX1 and 11 routes will combine to provide buses between Westgate, Lincoln Road, Te Atatu and the City Centre in both directions every six minutes, from 7am to 7pm, seven days a week," she says.

"Local trips to hubs like Henderson will also be much easier, with more buses more often."

The Northwestern Bus Improvements are seen as the first step towards providing people with more frequent and reliable public transport choices in the area.

Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency will continue to investigate long term options for a Rapid Transit Corridor between the city centre and Westgate.

Westgate Bus Station

The design and resource consenting process for a new Westgate Bus Station is underway. Construction on the station is expected to begin in early 2024. In the meantime, there will be interim bus stops at Westgate to support the new bus services.

The Northwestern Bus Improvements are a joint AT and Waka Kotahi NZTA project to deliver a range of short-term bus improvements to support growth in the region.

The project is being funded in part by the

Government to help New Zealand's economic recovery and create a future pipeline of work.

The COVID Response and Recovery Fund has provided \$50 million of the \$100 million projects to support this work.

About the bus route changes

From April to June 2022 Aucklanders had the opportunity to express their views and share their feedback on proposed changes to bus services in West Auckland.


Following consultation in 2022, AT has refined West Auckland's all-day, 7-day bus network to meet the needs of the wide range of existing and future users.

As a result of the feedback and budget constraints (following the 2023 Auckland Council budget saving requirements, Auckland Anniversary Weekend flooding and Cyclone Gabrielle),

AT has made changes to 13 of the 20 bus routes that were proposed in the 2022 consultation.

The changes will provide:





- Increased access to frequent bus services. (A 'frequent' bus services operates at least every 15 minutes from 7am to 7pm, seven days a week).
 - · More bus services throughout the day
- A bus network that meets growth expected in Northwest Auckland
- More reliable and quicker bus journeys into the City Centre
 - A simpler bus network

Fuel prices, a month on and how this is affecting all of us

A month on and we look at how the fuel price rise has affected our community.

New Zealand commuters saw the Government subsidy end on 30 June this year. This meant the 25 cent per litre discount on fuel was no longer. With petrol prices rising, Aucklanders flocked to the petrol pumps to fill their tanks at the reduced price one last time.

With New Zealanders wanting to seek out the best price possible a huge surge was seen in members of Gaspy app. Gaspy is a fuel finding app that compares petrol prices, it tells you where the cheapest fuel is in your area. The app had almost 6,500 new users on the Friday before the subsidy ended, and a further 3,000 on Saturday. Normal app signups are around 500 new members per day. This app provides commuters insights across the cheapest fuel available and in some cases may push some stations to reduce their prices to stay competitive.

According to the Gaspy app in July the NZ average fuel price was \$2.63 for 91 and \$1.87 for Diesel.

Mid June prices saw 91 Unleaded around \$2.11 to \$2.55 per litre. This roll-on effect of increased fuel affects not only families directly from their pocket but also every household through the cost of everything being delivered by a truck. Freight delivery is basically everything we consume and purchase. Local Northwest families are struggling with the added fuel cost in conjunction with higher living costs. Stats NZ show food prices for June 2023 were 12.3% higher than in June 2022.

Westgate does offer the local community an advantage over the rest of New Zealand regarding fuel prices. With the arrival of Costco Fuel members can get 91 Unleaded fuel at cheaper prices, around 20 cents cheaper than the New Zealand average. So how do the rest of the fuel stations around West Auckland compare?

The top 10 cheapest fuel stations for 91**, 6 of these stations were in West Auckland. With Costco Fuel offering 91 Unleaded 20 cents cheaper than the NZ average, this has made a lot of locals happy they are so close to some of the best Auckland fuel prices.

Matariki 2023 - celebrated all over Auckland

Matariki is a time to gather with whanau and friends to reflect on the past, celebrate the present, and plan for the future. In Maori culture, Matariki is the Pleiades star cluster and a celebration of its first rising in late June or early July. This marks the beginning of the new year in the Maori lunar calendar.

The dates for the new Matariki public holiday were announced in 2021 by the Government in partnership with the Matariki Advisory Group. The first public holiday to celebrate Matariki was on Friday 24 June 2022. We celebrated the second year as a public holiday on Friday 14th July 2023.

A range of events were held across the Northwest region throughout the month of July and were thoroughly enjoyed by the all.

Westgate/Massey

- Te Manawa Night Market: a mãkete (market) of Mãori vendors, with yummy kai (food), arts, crafts and more was on offer on 22nd July.
- Massey Matariki Brunch. The Massey matters hosted a delicious Matariki breakfast prepared by talented local foodies. Celebrating Matariki with kai (food), kõrero (conversation) and waiata (song).

While **Henderson** had a range of events. Corban Estate

- The Dawn Wishes to Hiwa-i-te-Rangi:
 Where you could write your wishes, hopes
 or dreams for Matariki on the back of a
 paper wishbone, before tying it to the
 whai. During the time when the Matariki
 cluster is visible in the sky, the gathered
 wishes were burnt, sending them up to
 Hiwa-i-te-Rangi to be granted as part of
 the morning ceremony.
- The Homestead Galleries offered a group exhibition of Mãori artists, showcasing works that speak to ngã whetu (the stars), Puanga and the Matariki cluster.
- Kia Ora Shorts Shorts film screening to experience te ao e ai ki tã te Mãori titiro, the world through a Mãori lens. Showing a selection of short films from filmmakers of Mãori descent
- Matariki Manu Aute. Corban Estate Arts Education Team offered manu aute (Mãori kites) making which combined traditional techniques, such as the tukutuku stitch and binding, with contemporary materials and colours.

- Marama Matariki Pounamu a full day creating a marama pounamu (pounamu

pendant) in this tikanga-based (protocolbased) contemporary workshop taught by Maha Tomo.

 Matariki ki Waipareira- Catherine Street was closed off to make room for stalls and a stage for artists who put on a show of kapa haka (cultural arts). This event offered stalls, plenty of music, and information about Matariki for everyone.


