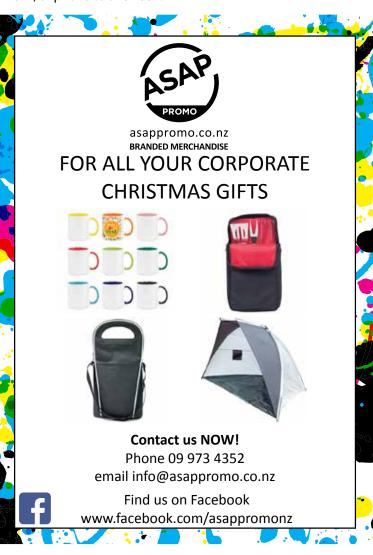

Community Policing Centre

With all the new building developments happening in the area, Police have seen an increased rate in thefts and burglaries happening at various building sites around these areas. If you are out walking, cycling or travelling in your vehicle and see anything you do not feel comfortable with, please report the activity you observe straight away.

There is a misconception from the general public that 111 is purely an emergency telephone number. This is not always the case, and Police urge members of the public to call 111 or *555 when seeing any suspicious persons, vehicles or other incidents in your neighbourhood. It is better and more likely Police will speak to or apprehend suspects and offenders if it is reported on these numbers at the time, not waiting until the next day to report to the local Police Station. It is for the call dispatchers to decide the priority given to the incidents, so please do not feel you are wasting Police time calling 111 or *555 for what you think are trivial incidents. Remember, registration numbers, colour, type and make of vehicles are important.

InBrief updates:events

The herb column

Lavender oil – An ideal oil to put in your First Aid Kit in the car. Known for its anti-inflammatory, antifungal, antidepressant, antiseptic, antibacterial and antimicrobial properties. It also has antispasmodic, analgesic, detoxifying, hypotensive and sedative effects.

Use it as a relief for muscle or joint pain, as well as for skin conditions like burns, acne and wounds. Make sure to dilute it with carrier oil e.g. Sweet Almond oil available at the supermarket. As an inhaler add a few drops to a bowl of hot water, and then breathe in the steam. Use as a compress by soaking a towel in a bowl of water infused with a few drops of lavender oil. Apply this to sprains or muscle injuries.

Moving schools

For most children, moving schools or making that jump from intermediate to high school can be a big deal. If the family works together it can mean a lot less stress all round. Your child will probably be experiencing a mixture of emotions ranging from excitement to a sense of loss and even fear. The move from intermediate or full primary to high school is especially confusing in many ways. Children have to deal with both 'endings' and sadness while at the same time anticipating new beginnings. This may include feelings of excitement and nervous anticipation. Old friends may be left behind and the fear of the unknown looms ahead.

Even for well-adjusted children this can be a daunting experience. If your child is struggling in other ways due to family disruption, moving to a new location, falling behind in their school work or other problems, the thought of all the change involved with moving to a new school can be daunting. However, there is plenty you can do to make this a positive experience for your child:

- Do some research yourself so you can understand the emotions your child may be experiencing
- Remember, kids don't always know how to express their feelings, they may act out in other ways instead of talking about how they are feeling
- Put yourself in their shoes think back to your first day at a new

school or high school

- Make sure they are confident in their school work. It's important that reading and maths skills are up to standard before they enter high school
- Ensure you are ready as a family take care of the practical things such as uniforms, books and school bags
- Be patient! It may take time for your pre-teen to adjust to their new environment

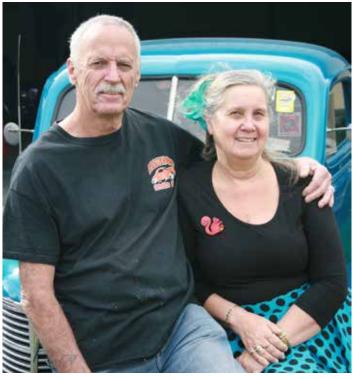

Hot rod heaven



Ken and Desma Galvin love cars.

It's what brought the two Kumeu Classic Car and Hot Rod Festival organisers together in the first place.

Desma had her car broken into in Auckland and wiring pulled out. "I was walking down the road crying and Ken and his brother were leaning over their fence. I thought 'here's a guy who can fix my car," Desma recalls.

That was about 40 years ago, and they've been married ever since.

Both were interested in cars early on. Ken grew up in a family of car enthusiasts and was so keen he fudged his age to get his driver's licence at 14.

"I've always been into cars," he says. "I love old machinery and talking to the people involved."

The self-confessed "tinkerer" will tackle anything with an engine, like the golf cart with a GSX-1100 motor he's working on. They have seven vehicles at their Kumeu home, including a 1948 Ford truck Ken's working on for their son. Yes, their children and grandchildren have the car bug. Ken's doing up a kid's drift kart for grandson Indiana Galvin-Pates, 1, already showing a fascination for machinery.

Some vehicles are used regularly, like the 1938 Chevrolet coupe Ken got for Desma on Mother's Day in 1987. Others need work, such as the Pontiac yellow taxi used in Sir Peter Jackson's King Kong movie.

"It's a way of life," Ken says. He's a life member of the New Zealand Hot Rod Association and Wheels Incorporated, as well as

being a National Street Rod Association member.

Ken's passion, particularly through custom painting and pin-striping cars, led to him owning a corporate branding company. He did many of the 1990 Auckland Commonwealth Games signs.

The couple have been involved in the Kumeu hot rod show from the outset and are already preparing for a big 25th show anniversary in 2019.

Meanwhile, they're hard at work on the 23rd festival on January 21 and 22 at the Kumeu Showgrounds. It attracts more than 40,000 people, and has international interest.

At least 5500 classic cars and hot rods feature in the festival's outdoor displays. Showground sheds include a construction shed with cars in various rebuild stages, one for custom built and painted cars where the People's Choice award winner is usually found, and a model car display. A Mad Max style "Volksrod salvage wagon" was last year's People's Choice and features on posters for this festival.

A Miss Kumeu contest is introduced for girls 10 and under, with other categories including up to 21-year-olds and a Mrs Kumeu section, contestants dressing 1950s style for prizes. The same theme is carried through the "Retro-o-rama" market area.

A Jimi Hendrix Tribute Show features on the Saturday and the Dreams Fleetwood Mac Tribute Show is on Sunday, both 11am - 5pm.

American style dragsters or "funny cars" will do fire-ups at Gasoline Alley, while show visitors can explore more than 70 trade stalls, check the "swap meet", sample some of the 26 food stalls, or test the children's rides and firefighters' Wendy House.

Kumeu Lions are collecting for surf life saving, and show entry is \$15 adult and under-12 free on Saturday 7am - 6pm and Sunday 8am-5pm. Parking's free and a ban applies to motorcycles, dogs and showground "cruising".

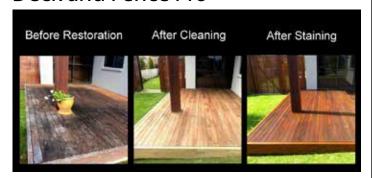

Relationship property agreements

Relationship property is something which must be shared equally between the parties at the end of a relationship. However, there are 3 sorts of relationship property agreements. The first is often called a prenuptial agreement because it comes before the relationship is one which qualifies for the equal sharing provisions under the property relationships act 1976 ("PRA"). The 2nd is often made during our relationship and endeavours to contract out of the equal sharing provisions for various reasons. Reasons include protecting assets to ensure children from a prior relationship are protected. The 3rd sort is usually made at the end of a relationship and usually allows for any equal sharing of the relationship assets as at the end of the relationship. Frequently, it will involve a division of actual assets as between each party as an alternative to an outright sale of all of the assets. In each case, a PRA agreement is not binding unless it has a lawyer's certificate. It could therefore allow your ex-partner to ask for further assets from you at a later date. 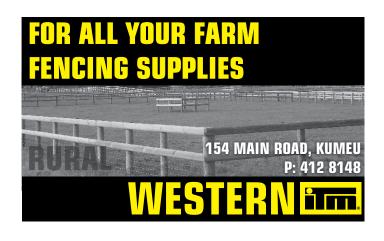

Caring for your Japanese Maple

Awa Nursery has some stunning specimen size Acer Palmatums (Japanese Maples) in stock. Beautiful stunning reds and greens are such an eye catcher in the garden and these are no exception. The Japanese Maples are



very versatile and adaptable trees. They thrive in most soils and climatic conditions. Care and attention at planting time is key to a healthy maple. Japanese Maples have a shallow fibrous root system. Be sure to apply a mulch around the tree to help retain moisture. Your planting site must be reasonably well-drained to avoid waterlogging. Your maples will thrive if they are planted in a location where they get sunlight during the day, a small



amount of shade in the afternoon, and are sheltered from the wind. Sunlight enables the deep rich colours in the foliage. Major pruning should be done in the dormant season after all the leaves have fallen off. Corrective pruning can be done at any time of the year except between late winter and early spring when the tree is devoting all of its energy into the development of new foliage.

Here we are in spring with abundant pasture

This pasture is ideal for stock, rich in nutrients, low in fibre and highly digestible. Now is the time to plan how best to use this feed. You want to keep your pasture at the leafy green stage. Graze your paddocks hard and most importantly, evenly, rotate your paddocks or strip graze more frequently than at other times of the year.

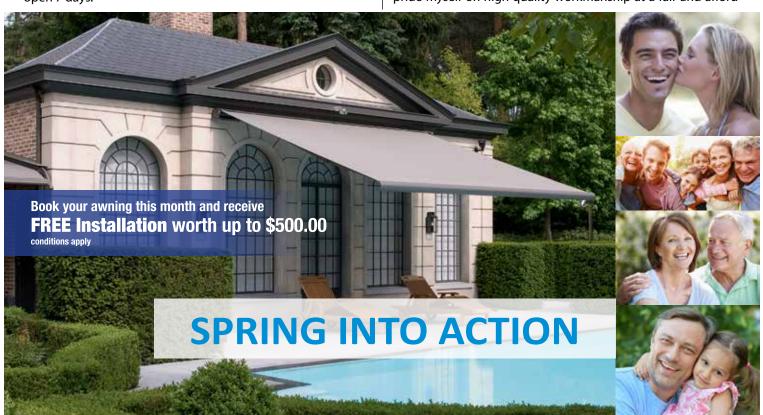
If you still have excess feed, think about turning it into silage, talk to a contractor about this, they will advise when it's best to cut before it turns to hay. Once cut, apply some nitrogen fertiliser to get them going again, this should help you keep green feed into summer. When pasture dries out in February you will have that silage to feed out. Topping your paddocks after grazing will get rid of the long stalks that stock avoid. Don't top too low if its dry, this will keep the sun off the roots and stop the soil from baking.

NIWA believe we should have a fairly normal summer with the chance of slighly higher rainfall and temperatures. Let's hope so, I am over these blustery conditions. In the Vegetable garden

- Leek Planting Tips Digger prefers the newspaper wrapped seedlings from Awapuni Nurseries: www.awapuni.co.nz/online-shopping. It is best to drop leek seedlings into deep holes around 20cm deep and let the soil gradually fill in the hole by itself. By planting so deeply you are blanching the leeks (creating the white part). Old gardeners tip: cut off half the green foliage straight after planting
- Watering is best done daily, or minimum three times a
 week at the roots of your vegetable plants. Adding straw or
 other organic mulches around edibles reduces the amount
 of water required good practice if you have limited water
 over summer
- Herby heaven imagine a table at Christmas groaning with the weight of smart salads packed with lots of herbs – that's perfect because basil, coriander, mint and dill are fastgrowers and need constant harvesting!
- Potatoes Continue to hill up the ones that are mid-season ripening, but look out for the yellowing tips of the early season spuds – you might get a feed in time for Christmas Dinner!

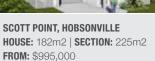

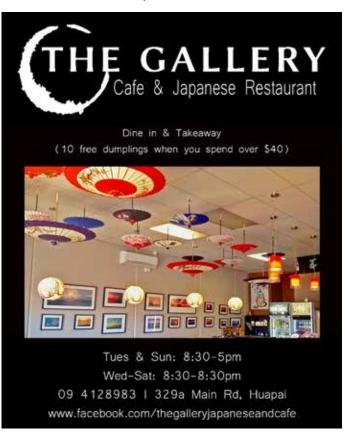

Finding an injured animal

Imagine you're on the way back from the shops and you spot a cat lying on the side of the road. You pullover to check on it, but can't see it moving. You need to check if it's alive, but how do you do that on an animal?

If you're shocked that you're not sure what to do, don't worry, you're not alone! Even though lots of us have pets, many wouldn't know what to do! This



article will teach you the basics of helping an animal whether it is your own or someone else's.

First thing you need to do is look out for any signs of movement as you're approaching the animal. If the animal moves at all it is alive and you need to get it to the vet. If there is no obvious movement then focus on whether or not you can see the chest rising and falling, this will show if the animal is breathing. If you can't see the chest moving then try putting your hand in front of their face to see if you can feel their breath. If they are breathing

then they are alive so get them to the vet!

If they are not breathing it is time to check for a pulse to see if the heart is still beating. Just like us you can feel for an animal's pulse on their neck but they have a lot of extra skin and fur there so it could take a while. The easiest thing to do is to feel for the femoral pulse on the inside of the animal's back leg.

If the animal has a pulse then their heart is still beating but you need to get them breathing again so start rescue breathing. If there is no pulse, the heart has stopped and you need to start compressions.

Unfortunately rescue breathing and compression can't be explained in this article but attend a PET First Aid course and you will learn these essential skills as well as many others! Laura Purkis - www.petfat.co.nz.

Summer dog care

With the weather heating up we can all look ahead to summer again. I want to share with you some useful tips to make summer easier on your furry family member. In the colder months it's great to pop your dog in the



car with you as you drive around to do jobs, but as the weather heats up your car becomes an oven for your pet. It's best to leave them at home where they have access to shade and water. When you are popping out and leaving your pup at home to relax, leave out at least two water bowls in case he gets really thirsty or knocks one over. If they are inside leave a few windows open for airflow, or leaving the air conditioning on low is also a great option to keep your dog comfortable.

When walking your dog try and get out early in the morning or later at night when the pavements are cooler. Not sure if the pavement is too hot for your dog? Place the back of your hand down on the concrete and hold it there for a count of 5 - if you can't them it's too hot and you will burn your dog's paws.

But what do you do if you need to walk them when it's hot? Take your dog to a dog park where it can walk on grass or to one of Auckland's all year round dog-friendly beaches so they can get in the water (Kennedy Park or St Leonard's beach) and remember to take a bottle of drinking water with your dog this summer.

Most important of all is to have fun with your dog this summer. Get out in the great weather and explore around Auckland as there are some great places that you and your dog can go.

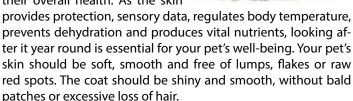

5 Top Tips - healthy skin & coat for cats and dogs

We're well into spring and that's usually associated with allergies for both humans and pets. Scratching and biting can quickly impact on the condition of your pet's skin and coat, but it's important to take into account the bigger picture, beyond just the allergy season.

The condition of your pet's skin and coat is a good indicator of their overall health. As the skin

- 1) Allergies: Allergies can be difficult to diagnose, with symptoms varying greatly. If you have any concerns or notice your pet excessively scratching or licking, thinning hair, bald patches





which should be carried out at least once a week. It's important that you use the correct tools for your pet's coat type. We recommend using a brush with widely spaced teeth for the outer layer, and a finer soft-bristle brush or comb to maintain their inner layer of fur and the fur around your pet's face. Using a slicker brush is a great way to finish grooming as it smooths down the top layer of the coat.

- 3) Bathing: How often your pet needs to be bathed depends on their lifestyle, age and coat type. The average dog only needs to be bathed every 4-6 weeks when they get dirty. Cats only reguire bathing when their coat is particularly greasy or dirty with grime or a sticky substance they can't remove themselves. It is important that you are not bathing your pet too regularly and are using a shampoo designed specifically for your pet.
- 4) Nutrition: A balanced diet with adequate quantities of protein will help strengthen your pet's fur as it's mainly made up of protein. Dull, fragile hair which sheds excessively can be an indication of ill health or that your pet isn't getting everything they need from their diet. The first ingredient on the food label should be a source of easily digestible protein. Omega-3 fatty acids in flaxseed and fish oil may reduce itching and inflammation in skin and add shine to a pet's coat. Zinc and vitamin A can help pets that have dry scaly skin, however it's important to always get your vet's recommendation on supplements suitable for your pet as excessive amounts may cause harm if given for long periods of time.
- 5) Flea and parasite control: Keeping your pet's flea and parasite treatments up-to-date is vital to their health. The presence of parasites can lead to allergic reactions, infections and itchiness and discomfort for your pet, all of which are avoidable with regular treatment.

Summer is coming

As the warmer weather starts, there are a few factors to keep in mind regarding our feet. Here are a few tips to keep your feet happy over the warmer months:

- Regularly moisturise your feet. When our feet come out of shoes into sandals/jandals/bare feet they dry out. Dry feet build up callus (hard skin) faster. If the skin is particularly dry the callus can split, leading to discomfort and pain.
- Avoid long periods of time with nail polish on. Nail polish can compromise the integrity of the nail and make it more susceptible to fungal infections. If you have a fungal infection the nail polish seals the infection in and can act as an incubator. If this is a foreign concept to you, try and go one week polish free between applications.
- Use an antifungal powder if your feet are trapped in hot sweaty shoes all day. Fungal spores love this type of environment and flourish in the warmer weather. This is good preventative care to ensure you don't get stuck with a fungal infection.
- Warm up and cool down when partaking in sports. The

warmer weather generally brings more activity and for those that have been more sedentary over winter this can be a shock to the musculoskeletal system. It is a good idea to ease into your activities slowly increasing how frequently you are partaking or the duration of the activity. This will help avoid injury. Another great way to avoid injury is to do a gentle warm up prior to exercise and a cool down and stretch at the end of your activity, again this helps to lessen the risk of injury.

• Stretch your feet. When barefoot and in sandals there are different loads on the muscles of the foot and ankle compared with closed shoes. This can mean the muscles in your feet are working much harder! It is a good idea to stretch your feet every evening to loosen these muscles. Rolling your foot over a tennis ball or cricket ball works well to loosen the tightened muscles of the foot.

The pain of a pulled elbow

Sadly, it is not often in medicine that a doctor is able to instantly 'heal' a patient. Most of my job as a GP and an Urgent Care physician involves monitoring chronic conditions and organising tests in order to make a diagnosis. And once the diagnosis is made, I oversee that the patient gets better; or is adequately managed. This often takes time.

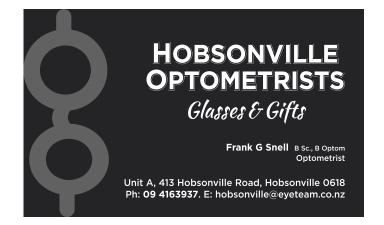
One exception to this is a common condition called a pulled elbow. This is an injury that affects young children, usually under the age of five. Another name for this is a 'radial head subluxation'. A subluxation basically means a minor dislocation, and

the radial head is the beginning of the radius (one of the forearm bones) which makes up part of the elbow joint.

A pulled elbow mostly occurs in one of a few circumstances. It can happen when a child is pulled forcibly by the hand by an adult. This can be when a child is swung by the hands or when a child runs from an adult and the adult pulls them back. This force can be strong enough to pop the radial head out of its correct position within the joint. The result of this is usually a child who refuses to use the arm and, when questioned, points to pain in the elbow or the forearm.

If this happens, the child needs to be taken to the doctor where they can have the elbow relocated. Often this can be done without needing to do an x-ray. This manoeuvre is quick and simple for a trained doctor, but the child must be examined by a doctor because sometimes an x-ray is required to rule out a fracture. Usually the elbow clicks into place during the manoeuvre. Afterwards the child is placed into the play area in the waiting room. After a little apprehension the child usually starts to use the elbow as before. The child still needs monitoring; particularly for the next three weeks as the elbow can easily pop out of place again. If this happens, then they need to be brought back to see the doctor.

The main thing to remember is never to pick a child up by the hands. I have seen dozens of these injuries and although most children fully recover, suffering from a pulled elbow and having it manoeuvred back into place is never a pleasant experience for children and parents alike! 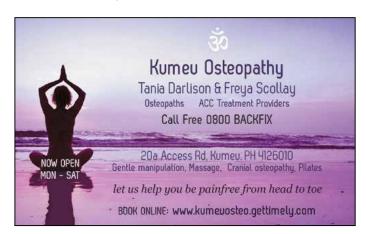
Why sitting can be so bad for our bodies

Anecdotally, 80% of our clients who experience spinal pain, predominantly have sit down jobs. Our musculo-skeletal systems like movement. Of course excessive loads such as a heavy lift have the potential for injury, but the insidious loading of our muscles, tendons and nerves through poor posture can accumulate strain and load over days, weeks or even years. This accumulation explains why seemingly trivial mechanisms cause significant injury or appear for no obvious reason. This sneaky buildup of strain can be minimized by attention to ergonomics, regular movement and staying fit through good exercise. Once you start experiencing symptoms, it is important to identify the primary contributing structures which are not always where the pain is coming from and address the underlying causes. Why am I sore after massage?

So you've been for a therapeutic/deep tissue or sports massage and the next day you woke up feeling like a truck ran over you! The massaged part of your body is tender to the touch and perhaps a little puffy. It is common to have some mild pain and even slight swelling after receiving deep corrective massage - this is called therapeutic inflammation. It's the result of new





white blood cells arriving at the area to clean out all the old, dead waste products in your tissues. Unfortunately, that can cause a little discomfort. Sometimes when muscles are tight for a long period of time, your brain can shut off sensation to that area. Massage re-awakens your brain's awareness of those tissues, causing tons of new working blood cells to come in and clean everything out that has built up over time.

The takeaway is that massage can be uncomfortable at times but should never be intolerably painful. Stay hydrated, communicate your comfort levels with your therapist and be aware of the original reasons for coming in for a massage. Probiotics

Probiotics are good bacteria that help support good health and vitality. Probiotics are great at helping improving your digestion, reducing symptoms of irritable bowel, increasing the resistance to infections and boosting your immune system. This is possible because around 70% of your immune system resides in the gut.

The imbalance of good and bad bacteria can be caused by diet, lifestyle, excess alcohol, stress, certain medications and exposure to toxic substances. Yoghurt does provide some probiotics, but to a much lesser extent. For example, one capsule of an Inner Health Plus probiotic is equivalent to 22 tubs of yoghurt! Probiotics have been commonly used in conjunction with antibiotics, as antibiotics kill both good and bad bacteria. It is important to ensure there is at least a two hour window between



the antibiotic and probiotic, to ensure no beneficial bacteria is also killed off. For best results, it is recommended to carry on with the probiotic for at least four weeks afterwards. However to aid in general wellbeing, digestion and immune system, regular use is recommended.

There are many probiotics available on the market, some shelf stable and some fridge stable. Available in capsules or powder for children. They also contain different strains which help in many different ways. There are specific probiotics which research has shown works better for irritable bowel syndrome, eczema and allergies. It is very important to get the right strain and the right doses, so it is important to talk to your pharmacist to see what product is best for you.

A day in the life of a Maori village

The kaumatua gather on the highest peak of the oldest maunga (mountain) where the sun has begun to shine upon the land filtering onto the ancient village where the whanau are awakening. Pakeke (adults) stand behind the sacred carvings that shield their village, while the chief presses his chapped lips to the putatara (conch shell). The visitors come with ketes full of kumara from the earth and shellfish from the sea. Wahine (women) in



front and tangata (men) in the back. The elders move down the gravel path leading to the entrance. The visitors pass through the gates into the depths of the village to begin their powhiri. The pakeke pray their blessing on the land, their whanau and themselves. They pray to Ranginui (the sky father) and Papatuanuku (the earth mother) for the growth of their precious crops and weather suitable for the days they are yet to greet. They tend to the hearth of the fire burning into the sky, they teach their tamariki (children) how to prepare the hangi that lies beneath the fiery pit of flames. They sing around the fire binding them all together with the waiatas they sing of the past, the present and the future to come.

The tamariki learn to sing their wise elders' words, they learn the wisdom of the past, present and the future. They learn to weave, carve, anything important for the future. They learn to cultivate land and use the produce grown wisely. They play te raku, as the sun's last light burns in their eyes.

The Marama (moon) illuminates the river that flows through the centre of the village. The maunga stands tall guarding the people who sleep under the protection of their prayers. The bold totem poles with carvings of stories passed onto generations are seen from a great distance reminding other tribes of their presence in the small world that they know. The front of the village stands unguarded and peaceful.

If it doesn't feel right – then do it

There is a part of our brain, a way we operate has humans that wants to keep us safe. Some people call it our ego, some call it our unconscious brain. But it's keeping us stationary. This part of us wants us to stay in our comfort zone and doesn't want us to feel uncomfortable - ever. Believe me, if we just ignored this little wee voice the forward momentum in our lives would be extraordinary.

Most of us will live within our comfort zone our whole lives without ever realising it. Often the way we are 'being' hides from us. My personal experience and what I have seen in clients is that life feels somehow dissatisfying, there is anger and sadness - we ask 'is this it?' Not realising that the gift of life has been right in front of us and we choose to stay where it feels 'right'. But it's not that it feels right, it's that it feels familiar. We are allowed to say no to someone, we are allowed to start that business, we are allowed to wear the funky dress in the wardrobe that we never wear. But we choose to stay where it feels comfortable. Almost everything in our lives right now is a bunch of lovely comfortable habits. Our perspective (or lack of) keeps us right where we are.

Most of the time new ideas or changing something in our lives is NOT going to lead to our demise or death. Usually once actioned, we would be either in the same position we are in now, or BETTR. Rising to a challenge usually brings deep satisfaction. We have all had fantastic ideas, and inspiring in the moment thoughts and it's us being creative and brave and authentic. Then the damn ego gets wind of it and we reason our way to 'it doesn't feel right, 'I don't have time' 'it's just not me' 'it's too expensive"I don't believe in it"I'll start tomorrow"I will look silly or will even give us anxiety. We think about this future event and emotionally embrace it in negative self-debilitating ways. What we are resisting right now is our biggest teacher!

But how do we know the difference between intuition or gut feeling and negative self-talk? Gut instinct is different from thinking. Perhaps intuition or inner knowing happens in the present moment. It's what propels us to do something or not to do something, or it gives us that inspired idea. The negative after voice is thinking. It's us thinking about a future outcome. Mulling over how something might be in the future is not intu-

That place where we make decisions from and reason from is not logical – it's emotional. Over 70% of the time our thoughts are negative, and keeping us stationary. Our thoughts come from our past. They only mean what we make them mean. Once we get our head around this we can start to take control. And

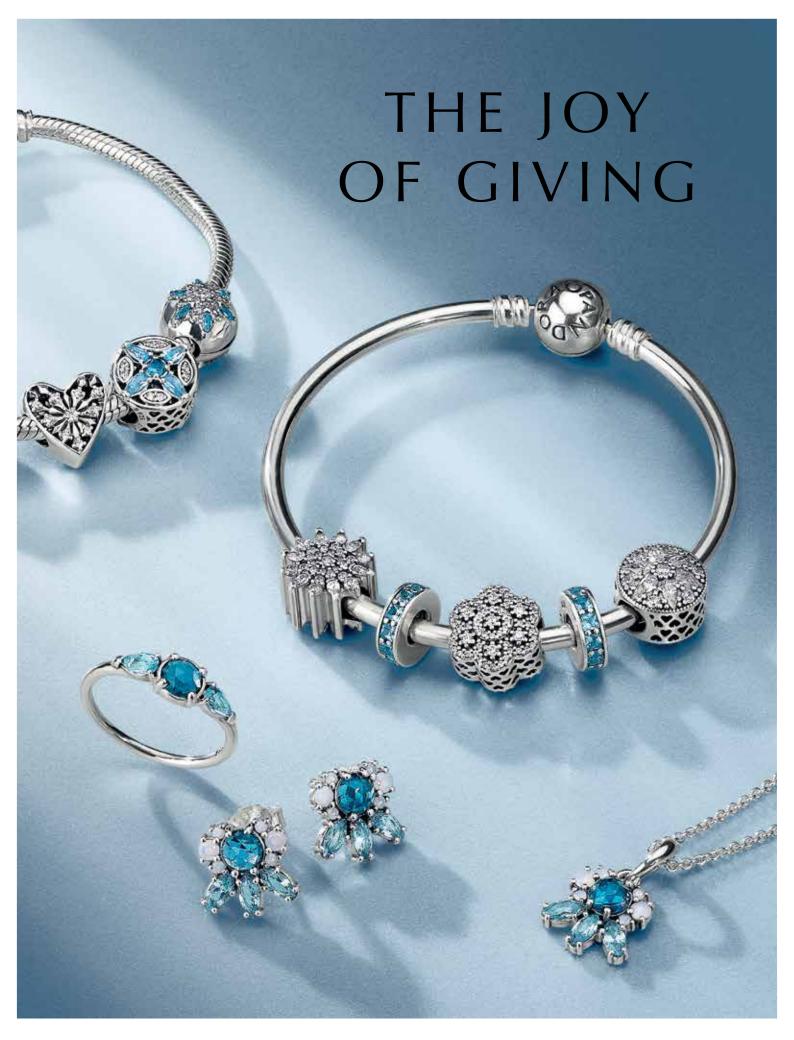
