Intro

We are what we eat. Your red blood cells are replaced every 120 days, and almost all your body renews itself every 7 - 15 years, depending on the tissue. So it matters what we eat, and you may wish to think whether you want to incorporate just any foods into your tissues. As Michael Pollan says in his book In Defense of Food (available through Auckland Libraries) "Eat food. Not too much. Mostly plants...Don't eat anything your great-grandmother wouldn't recognize as food". But we are all susceptible to the power of advertising. There are multi-million dollar companies trying (and obviously succeeding) to persuade us to buy all manner of convenient foods. Many of the "wrong" foods are those promoted by advertising. Supplements and vitamins are also heavily publicised. When recommended by a trained professional, these have their place, but based on advertisements, research suggests they are unnecessary as they can be provided by a good diet.

New Zealanders throw away over 122,500 tonnes away each year, half of which is avoidable food waste from buying too much and not storing it correctly. The current UK TV series "Eat well for less" (also on YouTube) educates families to plan their food shopping, to eat well and spend less, reflecting the role of Home Economics in The New Zealand Curriculum. Would you rely for your food choices on a trained educator, or a well-scripted advertisement? This month we have the benefit of contributions from two locals, a dietician and a pharmacist and nutrition medicine practitioner.

The Westerly this month should appeal to all tastes. Travel is on the menu. 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

Can you light a rubbish fire

New Zealand has sent 36 fire fighters to the United States and 65 to Canada to help combat the growing number of wildfires. Eight of the team that have been deployed are from the Auckland region.

New Zealand has agreements with Mexico, the United States, Canada and Australia to help in circumstances like these. Rubbish fires are proba-



bly the calls we dislike most. We often find ourselves "dammed if we do and dammed if we don't". On one hand we have the disgruntled person who lit the fire because if it is unsafe then we extinguish it. On the other hand, if the fire is safe then we will not extinguish it which then raises the ire of the person who had put the call in often for a smoke nuisance. A simple guide: Fire and Emergency NZ will only extinguish a fire if it is deemed unsafe. If the fire meets the permit conditions, is contained with no chance of it escaping and starting another fire then we will not extinguish it. A smoke nuisance is managed by Auckland Council. Composting lessons are booked with the Compost Collective and arrangements are underway to collect coffee grounds from the local cafes. 

Keeping West Auckland beautiful

The Massey Birdwood Settlers Association, the Rotary Club of Henderson and Keep West Auckland Beautiful are combining to clean up streets around Massey and Henderson on the 15th September.



The day is part of G J Gardner Homes and Keep NZ Beautiful Clean up Week, which this year is part of world clean-up day. Last year Keep West Auckland Beautiful and the Massey Birdwood Settlers Association picked up litter along Don Buck Road, between Red Hills Road and Royal Road roundabouts and contributed to more than 67000Kg of litter collected during Keep NZ Beautiful clean up week and the members were part of the 72000 people who participated in the project nationwide. The not-so-fun facts:

• Almost half of the plastic existing today, has been produced during the last 15 years. (National Geographic, June 2018)

· Plastic debris tends to accumulate at the centre of ocean gyres. The North Pacific Gyre, for example, has collected the so-called "Great Pacific Garbage Patch", which is now estimated to be about three times the size of France (approximately from 700,000 to 1.6 million km2).

• Every year 4.8-12.7 million tonnes of plastic finds its way into our oceans from the coastal areas and riverways. That is 15 bags filled with plastic waste per every metre for all the coastal lines



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in the world. If all this waste was put on lined up trucks, the line would stretch around the world 24 times. (Jemma Jambeck, University of Georgia, 2015)

• That also equals dumping the contents of one garbage truck into the ocean every minute. If no action is taken, this is expected to increase to two per minute by 2030 and four per minute by 2050. (Ellen MacArthur Foundation report, 2016

• From all the plastic ever made, only 9% has been recycled. (Jemma Jambeck, National Geographic, 2018)

• More than 3.5 billion people do not have access to the most elementary waste management services (ISWA, Globalization and Waste Management, 2012)

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NorthWest Rewards campaign

The NorthWest Rewards campaign ran at the NorthWest Shopping Centre between 18 June and 22 July. Eleven participating schools were lined up to grab a share of a \$6,000 total prize pool. Shoppers could allocate points to their school of choice. Partic-



ipating schools were Huapai District School, Helensville School, ACG Sunderland, Waimauku School, Riverhead School, Massey High School, Hobsonville Point Primary, Hobsonville Point Secondary School, Colwill School, Waitakere Primary School and Kaipara College. Winners were based on the highest average spend per student. In the end it was very close between Huapai District School and Helensville School, Huapai had 10,906 points, while Helensville had 10,241. Voters and schools were tracking each school's progress in-centre or via the NorthWest Shopping Centre website. There was a total of 2708 votes from the community for the 11 schools. Huapai, the overall winning school, will be using the \$3000 prize towards sun shades for their playground. Helensville School received \$2,000, and Hobsonville Point Primary received \$1,000.



Property market report

Since 2010 I have provided buyers and sellers with significant information on the number of sales and the value of property in the area. It helps both buyers and sellers understand the market, understand value trends and make better decisions. Over the next several months I will create a clearer picture of trending data relating to specific markets, and what you may expect due to development and pricing.

Hobsonville Point, home of the Block 2018 and a poster child for new-age housing developments. Land sales in the area are \$388,000 to \$475,000 over the last month compared to \$200,000 to \$466,000 for the year ending August 2018. Median value in the area sits at \$894,000 for the month compared to \$628,000 for the year ending August 2018. The highest sales upper quartile remains Constant around \$970,000. Sales volumes for the month were 21 units (average days on market 44) with annual sales at 306 units (average days on market 33) to year ending August 2018. Buyer groups are mostly younger mixed families with a cross section of children. Mature buyers (50 plus) make up less than 27% of the buyer grouping which holds consistent. This is a solid performing market for two to four bedroom homes with solid demand and stable pricing.

Huapai, home of Cadbra Developments and an area that is set for some significant infrastructure change over the next 24 months which should be welcome relief to residents and businesses alike. Land sales in the area are soft and good buying at \$344,000 to \$480,000 over the last 12 months to August 2018. Minimum sales value of home and land package is \$955,000 with a median price from last month at \$1,060,000 compared to \$1,000,000 for the year ending August 2018. High end pricing for new building activity on 600 sqm site sits between \$1,100,000 and \$1,180,000 which is comparable with the yearend figures. Sales volumes for the month were 6 units (average days on market 37 days) with annual sales at 64 units (average days on market 35) to year ending August 2018. This is a market struggling through infrastructure but will come back strongly when this has been resolved.

How to ensure your KiwiSaver withdrawal comes through on time

Applying to withdraw KiwiSaver funds (and the process of receiving those funds) takes time. KiwiSaver providers take no liability for delays in processing applications.

If the application has been filled out incorrectly, or does not include the correct supporting documentation, this can create extra delays in processing the application.

If the funds have not arrived from the KiwiSaver provider in time for settlement,

they cannot be used towards the purchase. You as the purchaser cannot get a loan from somewhere else to cover the short-fall (for settlement) and then use your KiwiSaver to repay that shortfall loan.

To ensure everything goes smoothly: Get pre-approval from your KiwiSaver as to how much money you can withdraw. Allow at least 10-15 working days to finalise finance conditions. Allow at least 10 working days from the date the agreement goes unconditional until settlement date. Submit your KiwiSaver withdrawal application as soon as you can. Company debt & personal liability

Can company debt become personal debt? That is, a company that is a separate legal entity from you personally. It should follow that you cannot be made responsible personally. However, there are instances where the Court has made a director responsible for the company debt and the cost of the liquidators (\$489,000 in total in a recent case). This is where a company has gone into liquidation in circumstances where there is inadequate record keeping by the directors. Keeping sufficient material so that a company can prepare accounts in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles is usually the starting

KiwiSaver to buy your first home

Having trouble getting into your first home? You will need a chunky deposit. Think about using your KiwiSaver if you've contributed for three years, you intend to live there for 6 months, and your scheme allows saving with-



drawals. 'Second time around' buyers may also qualify. Confirm your scheme allows withdrawals, and how much you can take out. You may be eligible for a HomeStart Grant (\$3,000 - \$20,000), depending on how long you have been contributing. If using KiwiSaver or HomeStart - tell your land agent to allow enough time in the agreement.



Feats of Clay

Hobsonville Point has a beautiful walk way and everyone knows about this picturesque loop around the Point. When I say loop, it is not quite the full circle yet but I'm sure by the time Santa is making his rounds it will be all finished ready for the Christmas bikes and scooters.

However, a small but fascinating local area appears to be less well-known by Hobsonville Pointers and I can highly recommend a jaunt to the bright yellow Clark's Footbridge.

Simply head down the road past the local supermarket and the park towards the bowling club and you will find this little gem. This bridge gives access to pedestrians and cyclists over the motorway but also provides an historical connection to the area and the pioneering ceramics industry founded here.



While crossing the bridge take time to admire the clay artworks beneath your feet. The ceramic tiles are fired from a variety of local clays. These reference the early clay pipe industry, initially based at nearby Limeburner's Bay and founded by the Clark family. These first rustic ceramics, fueled by a need to drain the poor farming land, led to the establishment of the famous Crown Lynn pottery. The tiles bordering the bridge were created by Waitakere artists, Matt and Kate



McLean and pave your way to the far side of the motor way. The tiles feature images of maps and topographical contours from the Hobsonville area and include truck and cycle treads.

Don't just look down at your feet though because when you raise your eyes to look ahead you will see an intriguing "window" sculpture by John Radford. The sculpture incorporates some of the windows salvaged from the original Sinton House homestead which was unable to be relocated at the start of the motorway project.

Once on the other side, there is a feeling of stepping into a remote country village where workers' cottages line the road. These cottages are deemed heritage buildings representing the area's early history and as a legacy of the Clark family, who provided significant local employment.

By turning left at the end of this country lane a walker can continue around towards Brigham Creek and back to the Point or for those looking for a longer walk or cycle, Herald Island makes for an interesting destination.

While investigating the background to the art work on the bridge, Leanne Silver, our resident photographer, and I took the opportunity to visit the free Crown Lynn Museum, Te Toi Uku, in New Lynn. What it lacks in size is made up for by the wonderfully informative and enthusiastic curator Ronnie Pace.

What a trip down memory lane! The white swans, the brown daisy plates, the cups and saucers we all seemed to have at home. Our visit was awash with, "Oh mum had a set of these" and "We've still got those plates at the bach" and," We had a set of these plates in our Dunedin flat".



The Clark family pottery legacy is fascinating and integral to the area, so cross that foot bridge when you come to it, you won't be disappointed.

Growing fruit trees

It is the time of the year to plant fruit trees, and at Awa Nursery we have plenty to choose from. Planting now ensures they have the rest of winter and all of spring to establish before their first



summer. You will want to choose a sheltered, open sunny spot for your fruit trees, with good drainage. Once you have chosen your tree or trees, (remember some trees need a pollinator) prepare your site well. Dig a hole that is slightly deeper than the root depth of your plant and partly fill with a good garden mix. Place some slow release fertiliser tablets in the bottom as well. Most of our fruit trees are recently bagged, having come to us bare rooted. The soil in the bags will be loose and the roots of your fruit tree must be kept moist. Hold the bag over the hole and cut it open so you do not lose any soil and disturb any new roots developing. Before back filling the hole, position the tree stake so you do not damage any roots. Firmly compact the soil, making sure your tree is no deeper than it was in the bag. Water



well. Water is very important when growing new trees, and regular watering in dry periods over spring and summer is a must. Mulch your trees, which will conserve moisture, protect the roots, add nutrients and prevent the growth of weeds. Make sure you do not have to mulch too close to the trunk. Damara sheep

Continuing my series on animals suitable for lifestyle blocks here's a beauty.

Damara sheep. Hands up who's heard of these guys?

I first came across these highly interesting and rare sheep years ago when I was farming in Australia. A breeder approached me to purchase some alpaca guard wethers to protect their highly valuable lambs from



predatory foxes, a major problem in Australia. Alpaca hate foxes which prey on their young in South America.

Damaras are a breed of sheep that migrated down from North Africa, and ended up in Namibia. They are what is known as a 'fat-tail' variety of sheep, but are probably better described as being 'fat-rumped.' They are a 'hair sheep,' growing only a short woolly coat in the winter, which is shed in the spring. They come in a wide range of colours, and most have unique coat patterns. Where are they found?

Damaras are now widely found in South Africa, where in the short time they have been farmed, they have gained an enormous popularity. They have been exported to a number of



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countries and have done particularly well in Australia. Although they are well suited to arid conditions, they are also found in a range of other habitats ranging from minus 20 degrees of cold and snow in Canada, through to high rainfall tropical forests in New Guinea. Demaras prefer well drained pasture due to their desert origin.

Although Damaras have been in New Zealand for a number of years, they are still considered very rare. There has been little regulated or recorded breeding, but recently flocks have registered with the New Zealand Sheepbreeders' Association, which will see the establishment of a sounder genetic base for the breed.

Why have them?

• Damaras are the ultimate easy care sheep. No shearing, no crutching, no tailing, and resistant to fly strike.

• They have a strong flocking instinct, which makes for ease of handling. They are excellent mothers and should never require assisted lambing.

• They can be hardy and adaptable, but prefer dry conditions. In many ways they have the temperament and requirements of goats, without the nuisance factor.

• They are excellent foragers and browsers, doing equally as well on poor unimproved pastures, as on good grasses.

• They are early maturing, and can average a lambing every eight months, with a high proportion of twins. They produce a high return of meat per hectare.

• They produce a high quality, fat free meat, ranking highly in tenderness and taste tests.

• They produce a high quality hide that is used in products such as furniture or fashion.

• The most impressive thing about the Damara is not just one thing, but the combination of such a large number of factors being found in one breed. It is highly prepotent, and stamps its mark strongly on any cross breeding programme that may be entered into.

The great outdoors

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

Other building guarantees have set limits in relation to the total amount that can be paid out for loss of deposit and/or non-completion, and some have excesses to pay on any claim. This means that the difference in the claim limit set by the guarantee company and the actual costs to complete the home then need to be paid by the client. Non-structural defects are covered for two years and structural and weather tightness defects are both covered for a period of 10 years from Practical Completion. Should a claim need to be made on the Completion Guarantee what is the maximum cover? The maximum cover available is the cost to complete the home (if any) over and above the remaining progress payments that are to be made under the building agreement. The provided cover is based on the home being finished as per the plans and specifications in the original building agreement, and any subsequent variations. What is the financial strength backing the Home Completion Guarantee? The Home Completion Guarantee is backed by a performance bond of \$1 million issued by ANZ Bank New Zealand, plus significant cash reserves. The performance bond and cash reserves are independently audited by Deloittes on an annual basis to ensure the bond and cash reserves are adequate to cover any potential claims. Treat Dad this Father's day with a delicious beer-infused chocolate cake. This is easy to make and is egg and dairy free. It can be served with whipped coconut cream or normal cream, chocolate icing (with or without dairy), and for some extra zing, some strained, tinned boysenberries can be mixed through the cream. Chocolate Cake Recipe: Pre-heat the oven to 175C and line a 23cm cake tin with a double layer of baking paper. Dry ingredients: 3 cups flour, 2 cups brown or



coconut sugar, 6 tablespoons cocoa, 2 teaspoons baking soda, 1 teaspoon salt; sift and mix the dry ingredients together in a large bowl. In a separate bowl or jug add the wet ingredients: (NOTE: if using 34 cup melted coconut butter, keep this separate from the wet ingredients, otherwise use ³/₄ cup of vegetable oil instead), 2 teaspoons vanilla, 2 tablespoons apple cider vinegar, 3/4 cup The Herbalist Manuka Ale and 1 1/4 cups water. Add the wet ingredients to the dry ingredients and fold through carefully. Spoon the mixture into the cake tin and bake for approximately 45-50 minutes or until a skewer inserted into the centre of the cake comes out clean. Allow to cool before icing. Quick Chocolate Icing: 2 cups icing sugar, 3 tablespoons cocoa, 1 teaspoon vanilla, 50g butter, hot water to mix. Soften butter and mix into icing sugar, cocoa and vanilla. Add small amounts of hot water until the icing is at a spreadable consistency. Serve a large slice of iced cake to Dad with a cold Manuka Ale.

Health advantages to having pets in the workplace

Many of us know the benefits of owning pets, companionship, exercise, unconditional love to name a few but did you know that studies show that dog owners are less likely to suffer from depression than those without pets. They have lower blood pressure in stressful situations and playing with animals can elevate levels of serotonin and dopamine, which calm and relax you. One study found that when peo-



ple with borderline hypertension adopted dogs from a shelter, their blood pressure declined significantly within five months. Test results also show pet owners have lower triglyceride and cholesterol levels (indicators of heart disease) and the list goes on. So do these benefits transfer to the workplace? According to a research study in the US there are three major benefits for bringing your pet into the workplace.

1. It reduces stress. A 2012 research study published in the International Journal of Workplace Health Management states that: On-the-job stress levels fell among a group of employees when they had their dogs at work with them.

2. It encourages longer working hours. Employees don't have to rush home to check on their pet. Studies show that organisations that allow pets in the workplace have employees who are willing to work longer hours and that absenteeism fell.

3. It improves working relationships amongst employees. Suddenly that person with bad manners and smelly breath becomes someone you can talk with when they bring their cute puppy into work.

One Auckland company have really stepping up and as part of their staff training brought in experts to run 6 classes and put over 300 of their employees through a Canine Body Language course. Not only was it fun and educational but it was a really positive and forward thinking educational programme for their team.

With the new Health & Safety at work act 2015 it highlights that the PCBU is responsible for risk assessment and have to either eliminate or minimise risk. So it becomes more important that companies have the buy in of their staff and training to minimise the risk around dog bites. For more information or if you



Country Pets

Harringtons Pet Food surveyed 2,000 dog owners finding the average pooch is taken out for a walk 10 times a week, with each trip lasting around 34 minutes. Four in ten owners say other dogs stop them from letting their pet off the lead more often, while 31 per cent worry too much to let their dog roam free. Others say they don't



let their dog off the lead because they aren't allowed to do so in the area they walk in (17%), they aren't well behaved off the lead (18%) or that they feel it's too dangerous (31%). But the study found that while 89 per cent enjoy walking their dog, 39 per cent admit a lack of time stops them from going out more often. Poor weather (47%), feeling too tired (20%) and finding it difficult to find places where they can walk their dog off the lead (9%) also means they don't go on as many walks as they should or would like to. Ok, so this is a UK based study, but the findings likely translate to working dog owners worldwide. If you're in the 39%, finding it too hard to get your pooch out for the level of exercise he needs to maintain good behaviors at home, consider the services of a professional dog walker. Replacing running shoes

Running in a shoe for too long (ie 3-4 years) can result in overwear and increase your risk of injury.

Over time, the cushioning in a shoe compresses and deteriorates, resulting in a harder feel to the shoe and therefore less shock absorbing.



Shoes also develop a wear pattern over time, ideally this is even, however if you are someone who either over or under pronates, this wear pattern can be detrimental and result in your feet being encouraged to under or over pronate further which in turn alters the load on your muscles and joints. To get the best out of the cushioning and support from the shoes and avoid injury, it is advisable to replace your shoes every 800-1000 km.

It is important to remember that shoe companies regularly update their shoes, changing the support, width, depth, cushioning, lace configuration and general feel of the shoe. Often these changes are minor, however sometimes they are bigger changes. If you have previously had a certain model shoe that worked well for you, the updated version may not feel as good, or could even cause pain. It is important to also remember that our feet, legs and bodies change over time as well. A pharmacist expands his toolkit to help heal himself and his patients

People often ask me: "Why is a Pharmacist so interested in nutrition?" The answer is simple; to help people get well. I have always wanted to be a pharmacist so that I could understand all about how medicines affect the body, and with that information I could help people to be healthy. But after about 15 years in the profession, I started to become disillusioned that so many of the people I was seeing in my pharmacy were not actually get-



ting better. Have you ever heard of anyone going on a medicine for high blood pressure and getting cured? Or pain killers curing arthritis? Unfortunately, for many chronic diseases the treatments reduce symptoms rather than cure.

Then the real turning point came. I got diagnosed with a debilitating chronic disease called ankylosing spondylitis. This is a nasty form of arthritis that robbed my father of his quality of life (and eventually killed him). This is when I started to look outside of conventional medicine for answers to this painful disease.

Nutrition Medicine to the rescue - At this time, I found the science of "Nutrition Medicine", and enrolled in a post-graduate course run by one of the most knowledgeable clinicians in this field; Professor Mel Sydney-Smith from RMIT University.

Using what I learned in my Nutrition Medicine studies I turned off my ankylosing spondylitis. To my delight, not only did I get complete relief from my painful and stiff spine, but I regained all my energy and vitality. At that stage I was in my late 30s and needed a sleep every afternoon to get through the day – crazy I know. After getting my nutrition right, I had the energy



to not only get through my standard day, but I started a Nutrition Medicine Clinic within Massey Unichem Pharmacy so that I could help other people with chronic medical conditions. I also started teaching other pharmacists about how nutrition could help their patients to get well. The outcome being an increased level of stress, anxiety, exhaustion and a rise in disordered eating and over exercising - all things we can do without when we are already dealing with sleep deprivation and all other changes a child brings to our lives.



Our relationship with our body and

food is like any other relationship. It changes during pregnancy, childbirth and motherhood. It needs to be nurtured not punished. It needs to be cared for not controlled. It needs compassion not judgement.

The overwhelming expectation that women's bodies are to go back to the body before they grew, delivered and fed a child (and in a short space of time) means we are judging instead of celebrating women's bodies. How do you mould and stretch a pair of shoes to fit your feet?

This is Shoe Talk's guide on how to make your new shoes fit your foot shape when you have purchased something new that you need to wear soon after purchase, please note this only works if the footwear actually fits your foot correctly to start with



shoes will only ever give in width a few mm and not at all in length.

So follow the following tips:

• If the shoes pinch your heels you can soften the heels by gently rolling the back of the heel over with your thumbs to soften the edge.

• Put on a pair of socks; grab your new shoes and your hairdryer. Turn the hairdryer onto warm and gently direct the head towards the shoe, approx 15cm away be careful though as you do not want to burn the leather, if it's suede put the heat even further away. Heat the leather up to where it feels malleable. Put the shoes on your feet and walk around them as they cool. The heat will soften the leather and allow it to mold to the shape of your foot. Repeat if required.

• Finally notice any points that feel like they will rub on the first



wear and put a plaster on this will ensure you have a great night and no sore feet or blisters!

Vacuuming can be dangerous

Vacuuming is perhaps the most common cleaning activity in our homes. Not a rocket science - hold the hose with an attachment and push-pull to gather the dust and debris. The usual stuff. Yet, it can be risky for our spines. Standing upright



and twisting around is not too bad, but the real problem may start when we try to get to those awkward places, such as under beds and hidden corners. • Trigger finger affects tendons to your fingers or thumb, causing catching and pain with movement

• The tendons that bend your fingers glide through a tunnel called the tendon sheath and the tendon or sheath becomes inflamed and swollen, causing catching and pain with movement



• Trigger finger is more prevalent in women; 40 to 60 year olds; occurs more frequently after activities that strain the hand e.g. forceful gripping and is associated with certain medical conditions e.g. diabetes

Treatment:

Splinting to rest the tendon for about six weeks

• Avoid aggravating activities while your finger heals e.g. applying pressure to the area by massaging or holding objects firmly; over exercising, repetitive gripping and avoiding contact with vibration

What your eyes can tell you about your health

Our series continues as Natasha Herz, M.D.*, clinical spokesperson for the American Academy of Ophthalmology, explains what your eyes reveal about your health, and how you know it's time to visit your optometrist.

to visit your optometrist. Today's tip: You're getting too much sun. Some people develop a yellowish patch or bump on the whites to the side of their iris, called a pinguecula. "A small percentage of these are pre-cancerous, but usually they're not," Herz says. "They're



most often seen in people who spend a lot of time in the sun." But a December 2013 study on ultraviolet light's effects on the eye found that wearing specific lenses protects your peepers from sun damage, so talk to your optometrist if you start seeing these patches.

Dealing with growing pains

Sorting traffic congestion is top of the list for Helensville MP Chris Penk, who's just completed his first year in office.



It's the number one bugbear in his electorate which covers north-west Auckland, a

rapidly growing region including Huapai-Kumeu, Helensville, Riverhead, Whenuapai, Hobsonville, North Harbour and Albany. Chris agrees it's a problem brought about by infrastructure failing to keep pace with development.

Any fixes - whether a bypass of State Highway 16, better public transport such as light or heavy rail extensions, highway widening or extensions – won't bring immediate relief.

Indeed, Chris believes much of his electorate population will be stuck with increasing congestion issues for some years yet, especially in travelling to and from other parts of Auckland.

He sees merit in the Public Transport Users Association's push to get a passenger rail service or a shuttle system extended from Swanson to Kumeu and possibly Helensville. That could provide quicker relief than some of the other measures proposed, Chris says.

"It's too far off for many of the fixes. We need to do something as soon as possible."

While the issue is probably as much a local government matter than central government, Chris says he's working alongside local government representatives and organisations like Auckland Transport and the NZ Transport Agency to get some positive outcomes.

Congestion not only causes frustration for those involved but adds considerable cost in wasted time and productivity.



A passenger rail or shuttle link could help take some of the pressure off the roads, Chris says.

He says electorate roads are poorly maintained, and he agrees with Rodney councillor Greg Sayers that more spending is needed on roads here.

The growing population, particularly around the Kumeu District, is also leading to pressure on local primary schools. A new one opens in Huapai next year, but Chris says the calls are coming for a secondary school here too.

"The Ministry of Education is saying there's insufficient population in the right age group to justify a secondary school here, but we need to start now," Chris says.

"Even the primary schools here are chocka."

Chris believes that having sufficient good schooling in the area might also prevent parents clogging up the roads to other parts of Auckland during school terms.

Meanwhile, Chris might be contributing to the growing number of vehicles on local roads by planning to introduce a mobile office.

OK, this probably wouldn't be on the road long as the aim is to park it up in key locations so Chris can learn more about people in different areas and their needs. He's hoping to get that on the road this year.

Being based in former Prime Minister John Key's electorate office in Huapai hasn't stopped Chris from already getting out and about.

He's hosted meetings such as one covering April's severe storm to avoid a repeat of the problems caused, and he's been visiting businesses, schools, churches, community events and other functions around the electorate.

When not required in Parliament, which can take up a full working week when sitting, Chris likes to spend as much time as he can in his electorate, talking to local people about what matters to them.

Chris also keeps in contact with the Rodney Local Board and other elected members.

His law background has come in useful too. "Those skills come in handy when advocating for people. When people need help with an issue I also have to be careful I don't take sides and keep an open mind, whereas being a lawyer I was going in to bat for my client alone."

Chris is therefore involved in court related matters for the National Party. He is assisting with reforms, for instance, to improve court procedures.

He has a close association with Rodney MP Mark Mitchell on both this and defence related matters, Chris having served time in the Navy.



Like his predecessor John Key, Chris says spending time in Opposition is a valuable learning curve and "good for observation", but he can't wait for National to be back in power to get more traction on various policies.

The next election in 2020 is also expected to come with some likely boundary changes to his Helensville electorate.

That's another outcome of the area's growth, with new boundaries expected to be set around March next year when results of this year's Census and the electorate's population are also to be released.

Chris, 38, says he's found his first year as an MP "very exciting" and that he's learned a lot, particularly from the people he's met. "I have a better feel for the whole electorate now."

A growing business

Van Lier Nurseries keeps coming up roses after more than 50 years in business.

While celebrations were held at the company's Riverhead Road greenhouse site on August 4 to mark its establishment as a limited liability company in 1968, the nursery has actually been running a lot longer.



Walter and Maria Van Lier, pictured, came to Auckland from post war Holland in 1951.

The couple first stayed in a Khyber Pass Salvation Army boarding house.

After church on Sundays they cycled around Auckland trying to find a suitable parcel of land to buy.

Opa and Oma (Grandad and Grandma), as they were known, soon found it and began growing potatoes and other produce on West Coast Road in Glen Eden in 1952 – 66 years ago.

But Walter had long nurtured a desire to grow flowers after spotting an opportunity in the cut flower market here.So in 1961 they obtained land at Chamberlain Road in Massey, developing a nursery which continues there today.

Firstly, they grew carnations, and then roses became their main crop in the 1980s with a focus on the export market, particularly Canada. The Riverhead nursery and greenhouses were established in 2001.

Extensions to the production greenhouses were made in 2014, and a propagation house was added in 2017.

Van Lier Nurseries has become the North Island's largest rose grower over the course of its 50 years, selling its flowers to florist wholesalers and even plants to other cut flower growers.

With more than 1.5 million rose stems produced annually, it's now the second largest in New Zealand,

Roses comprise about 60% of the company's revenue, chief operating officer Joanne Hurley says.



But it continues to produce a wide range of other flowers, including more than 10 different types. These feature gypsophilia, statice, helleborus, veronica, alstroemeria, parzival, limonium, solidago, florinca, green magma, Zanzibar foliage and, of course, carnations.

Imported tissue culture is grown up into plants in Van Lier Nurseries' plant propagation division, both for its own use and that of flower growers.

Maria died in 2012 in her 90th year and Walter died at the age of 96 in 2016.

Their son Theo bought the business in 1987 and runs it with his son and third generation family member Harry, pictured left, while another son, Steffan, right, is also involved in the business. Staff numbers vary between about 25 and 30, depending on the season, with some staff members serving for 20 years or more.

From the days when Walter could look at a plant and tell what it needed, the business has become more high-tech, particularly in water reticulation, shade screening and the use of gas for heating.

One thing remains constant – Van Lier Nurseries' reputation for high quality.

The greenhouses have even been used for functions other than growing. In 2015 a fashion runway was held there for Glassons and, appropriately, the Riverhead greenhouses hosted Van Lier Nurseries' 50th celebration attended by more than 200 guests entering through archways of flowers and foliage.

Theo thanks all who have contributed to making the business the success it is today.

Walter and Maria have left a lasting family legacy and it's sure to continue growing for a long time yet.

Yachts to help disadvantaged youth

A new lease of life is being given some yachts with interesting histories.

Auckland businessman and yachtsman Geoff Hunt is looking for people to help him with his project to tidy up two yachts in Kumeu and another in Waimauku.

It's part of the NZL 14 Foundation he's set up to restore six yachts to help young people considered at risk.

"The boats just need a clean-up, not a rebuild," Geoff says.

One of the boats is a kauri sloop which infamous drug trafficker Marty Johnstone sailed as a boy.

Two others have been sailed by Sir Russell Coutts, including America's Cup boat NZL 14 which Geoff bought and has in Queenstown Bay.





Some others are Etchells Class boats, designed by EW 'Skip' Etchells as an Olympic keelboat which is both fast and stable, and can be sailed by three or four people.

Geoff says he's getting disadvantaged youth to enjoy the benefits of ocean life through learning to sail.

He's particularly keen to help those with Asperger's, like a son and those with attention deficit hyperactivity disorders (ADHD), autism or other mental health issues.

"Being out on the ocean is the best medicine.

"I'd like to leave a legacy that continues after I'm gone," Geoff says.

He says a life on the ocean, including sailing boats for some of London's elite, has helped him, especially after leaving school without any qualifications. Geoff says he's had his share of ups and downs since.

He enjoyed the high life for a while, but it didn't last.

Geoff's had about 22 boats over the years, and still has "quite a few".

"But now I want to put my money back into things which help others."

He's also keen on having yacht clubs use some of the boats to help with training programmes.

"I'd like to recruit people to look after the yachts so that they always stay in good condition."

Emotions and eating too much

There are some of us who quite simply put more food in our mouths in any given day than others. There is lots of trying to lose weight in a variety of different ways but the love of food and the enjoyment of eating usually wins. Have you ever stopped to wonder why? People who don't understand emotional eating say its lack self-control and will power. But those things have nothing to do with it. At some stage in life – most likely when we were a child or teenager, we developed a relationship with food that was not based on survival or social enjoyment - it was based on feeling better. Food started to be a tool we used when we were sad or angry. It was used to soothe something inside us. This happened again and again and eventually became habitual. When I was much younger it became obvious to me that we all treated food differently. I studied closely how the people around me ate. I could see the way I treated food was very different than, for example, my sister-in-law.

I created a mini research project in my head. After watching for a few months, I labelled everyone either a type 1 or a type 2. If you are type 1 you don't eat much, you don't cook if you don't have to and usually nothing fancy. When you get stressed, depressed or worried you usually lose your appetite, you can easily only eat half a meal and not give it a second thought. You stop eating when you're full. Your body is naturally thin. A type 2

is generally a bit rounder, they have curves! They enjoy food, cooking it, and feeding people. When they get stressed, depressed or worried they turn to food for comfort. Type 2's have a different relationship with food, food is important and not to be taken lightly! They will nearly always finish everything on their plate and have dessert even when they are full.

Type 2's use food for an 'up' feeling. Like a drug. Not every moment of every day, but a lot of the time. All the feel-good chemicals go off like fire crackers. It is a habit as well as a coping tool. Type 1's naturally didn't develop this relationship with food (don't worry they have other habits!)

So why do we use food like this? Well as long as we are doing it, means we are still needing to feel better, we need a little cuddle on toast. Ask yourself, what is going on that is causing tension? What beliefs have you carried about yourself since you were little? What about you and the way you are perceiving yourself and your life feels not good enough? Feeling not good enough or not loved enough and situations happening throughout our days 'proving' this, will be a huge trigger for most of us. Other triggers are also our reactions to normal everyday life - logging on to online banking can cause tension, when the kids don't eat their dinner, when we think about the boyfriend who dumped us 10 years ago, when the boss calls a meeting, when the employee is late yet again, when we haven't brought the birthday present in time, when we wake up and there's no coffee. Even looking in the mirror and experiencing disappointment is an emotion that will need soothing. There are a million things to cause us tension if we choose and unfortunately to cope with it all we put food in our mouths.

I asked a client last week - 'do you really think it's possible to change your relationship with food'? Do you believe it's possible to eat only when you're hungry, and cut the cord linking you with food? To not have the 'wanting' or the 'need' all the time would be fun and freeing. When the cheese and crackers hit the table do you think it's possible to have half the amount that you usually would? What would it take for this to happen? It would mean being able to manage your emotions differently, with more awareness. Because I tell you, if it did happen, it would change your life. This is not so much about nutrition! Don't get me wrong, I love being educated about what foods are best for my body, but to begin with we need to look at HOW we are eating. Because over-eating the healthy chicken dinner you cooked last night is undoing all the good. Changing your relationship with food would make much of weight loss very effortless.

Dr Libby Weaver says, if you are putting something in your mouth and you're NOT hungry ask yourself 'what do I really want'? I used to say to myself "you will not find what you are looking for in this food". Ideally the goal isn't to become a type 1! Its tongue and cheek but you would be going for a 1.5. This sits nicely in the middle and is a relaxing, fun place to be. I believe it's totally possible to change your relationship with food. I help clients in this area. I have done a lot of work in this area myself and create powerful mediations around this. Meditation is the tool I use. It's no good doing a nutrition plan, at this stage it's about doing the inner work. Call Anna for a session 021 555 658 or email anna@thinkyourbest.co.nz.

My Science Playroom

We have noticed in the research and current practice that teachers and parents of young children have started to really analyse the way children play. Through these observations it became clear that children are taking their play seriously and are ac-



tually forming ideas and understanding of concepts that they test and apply after observing them in real life. When they have enough time and space to keep exploring an activity on their own with a variety of resources to enhance that 'research', they do come up with some amazing play scenarios. In our various dramatic play display areas we try to make sure that the resources are very relevant and encouraging interactive, innovative and creative play. We are noticing that regular children take up where they left off at a previous visit and take the play to more complex areas. These link directly into an integrated curriculum with outcomes than we would never have been able to do as teachers'teaching'. One example that I saw yesterday was of two

children of 6 and 7 years that decided to go on a space trip in the space ship. They planned their trip, checked the 'emergency escape capsule', the alarm system of dangers and then set up their areas for sleep, collected juice, water, vegetables and fruit for the journey from the vegetable shop and plants from the Nursery. All the while they delegated jobs to each other.....one went to fetch a baby, bed and food for the baby, the other went to fetch the medicines, "just in case they got ill!". One decided they need to take pets too. If you looked at it without knowing you would have thought it was a mess. But listening in to their play you realise the schemas that went on in this play, the thinking, understanding and forward planning that showed understanding for long and short term goals. At My Science Playroom at 406 Great North Road Henderson we are having fun creating new and exciting displays. When we started to analyse our visitor numbers we noticed that by 31st March 2018 we've had 25,300 visitors since we started in June 2016! We have also seen interest from locals who have started to engage and support displays, such as the local Queen Bee shop on Highway 16 that loaned us a working Beehive (without the bees) for children to look at. Another new display that is popular is the Augmented Sandpit where children (and adults) can move the sand around to form different kinds of topographical landscapes. It is a sensory play exploration that is very soothing and rewarding to play with. The magical outcomes that reactions from our chemistry experiments have for young children are always a favourite and are on offer every day that we are open from 11 am and again at 2pm. It is that time of the year when people plan end of year functions or parties and our facility are well suited for families who would like to have the facility exclusively for their own functions. 
